



Town of Cottesloe 2021 Local Government Elections - Voting

1. How do I vote?	The Town of Cottesloe holds postal elections conducted by the Western Australian Electoral Commission. If you are enrolled you will receive a voting pack in the post.
2. What if I don't receive a postal voting package?	If you do not receive a pack or your pack is damaged, you can apply for a replacement at the Town of Cottesloe Administration, 109 Broome Street, Cottesloe. ID will be required.
3. Is early or absent voting available?	No. Early or absent voting is not available for postal elections. If you are going to be away at the time of the election, you will need to get someone to forward your voting pack to you.
4. By when must the ballot paper be returned?	All ballot papers must be returned by 6:00pm on Saturday 16 October 2021 to be included in the count for the election. Please ensure you consider the time it will take for Australia Post to deliver your completed ballot papers to the WAEC. On Election Day, Saturday 16 October 2021 ballot papers can be personally delivered to the Returning Officer, between 8:00am and 6:00pm, located at the Lessor Hall, 109 Broome Street, Cottesloe.
5. Which of the current Elected Member's terms expire in 2021?	The Mayoral position is currently vacant. The terms of Councillors Young (South Ward), Harkins (Central Ward), Sadler (North Ward) and Tucak (East Ward) will expire in 2021.
6. Can I vote for the Mayor directly?	Yes. The Mayoral election is also being held on 16 October 2021.
7. When does the poll close?	6:00pm on Saturday, 16 October 2021.
8. When are the votes counted?	After 6:00pm on Saturday, 16 October 2021.
