The house was used as a residence for Council's head gardener for 10 years, and then upgraded for use by sporting bodies. In the early 1970s the Rugby Club gained approval for extensions and renovations to the house and continued to use the property. It was also used during the America's Cup as headquarters for one of the syndicates in 1986. If any alterations or replacement of this house occurs it would be important to mark the site of the original residence (note house was constructed 1918, says 1926 in 1995 Municipal Inventory).
