He said that the sand ladders at the base of several access paths are a constant maintenance problem due to the continuous sand erosion at that level. As noted in the 24 November minutes, at significant cost the Council tops up the sand on a regular basis, with a maintenance team and hired equipment. We discussed possible solutions, including concrete steps at the lower levels. I suggested that geotechnic bags, to stabilise the sand and allow for steps to be positioned, may be another solution worth investigation.	
In any event, I request that you replace all existing sand ladders, and in particular the one at the bottom of Grant Street, as a matter of urgency. It concerns me that this N7 situation is not even on the list of "needs" for access paths noted in your 24 November minutes and in your Beach Path Rationalisation Strategy. On the contrary, N7 is noted as "Recently upgraded" and is given your top rating of "1" as opposed to the other sand ladder paths. This completely masks and ignores a dangerous situation. As I said to David, I understand that I am not the only person to have come to grief at the very busy N7; it's a dangerous safety situation and certainly does not provide universal access. 



# Q2 What age group are you in?




