I am aware of the critical shortage of parking at Cottesloe Beach. I am also aware that over the past 30 years little has been done to alleviate this problem. I respectfully ask you to consider surrendering the grass areas along the foreshore to the much needed parking for the public.

You must be aware of the considerable income brought into the area by folks such as myself who frequent the shops and enjoy the ambience of coffee and or lunch next to the sea.

This time of year, I swim daily, and take advantage of the acrod parking, but now I am finding that is also difficult.

There is a discernable increase in population but the parking has not kept up with it. I am in favour of Barcheta increasing its floor space to accommodate the increase of business, but with this must come more parking.

Cottesloe, by virtue of its location, has the responsibility to fill the needs of its citizens, but it also has the increase of tax revenue not available to other suburbs. I look forward to your council's early consideration of this request as a just and timely improvement.

I would also suggest that the council put down pilings in order to stabilize the obvious slippage now happening in those cliff areas not underpinned by bedrock. Note that the Seattle area of the American Northwest has used piling for the past 100 years and it has worked well in a part of the northwest dug out by the ice age. Seattle in fact, sits on pilings set down early in its history.

I appreciate being kept in the loop at this very busy time of the year – I don't always have an opportunity to read the Post or follow developments through the council website.

I understand the carpark is being redesigned however I do think the loss of those bays will affect visitors and therefore businesses significantly – if there are no alternative bays being allocated elsewhere?

Thank you for dropping into our business regarding the above mention plan. Sorry we missed you. We have viewed the plan on the website.

Background:

We have owned and operated Amberjacks for over 10 years now. We have experienced the business highs of Daylight Savings time, and more recently the tougher economic situation in WA over the last few years. I can safely say that the possibility of losing Car Park One would have a greater impact on our business than either of these events.

We will offer feedback from both a business viewpoint and residents viewpoint:

Business Feedback:

From experience of having the car park closed all day for several years on the 31st of December, we can detail a loss of 50% of turnover compared to the years when the car park remained open.

A large proportion of our customers utilize the convenience of close parking proximity when making a choice to come to our venue.

We purchased the business for a significant amount of money. The value of our asset is directly linked to the high turnover of revenue. Losing this parking lot would significantly affect our business asset to such an extent that the flow on result for our family would be the need to suddenly reconsider our ability to afford living arrangements within the local area.

In relation to staff retention (which our business relies heavily on), the feedback from our staff is that ease of close parking access is a considerable factor in working at our venue.

Residential Feedback:

Pressure on parking availability can be significant at peak times. Already cars spreading up into the residential streets is a problem. Removing the main car park would only add to this problem. I can not imagine how the streets would cope during Sculptures by the Sea, if carpark one was removed. It would be a disaster with complaints from every resident living anywhere near the beach.

Opportunities:

In regards to the development of grass areas, plants and trees - our observation is that the existing grass areas in front of our business and on the southern side of Indiana's are not overly pressured. There is plenty of shade from sun and wind.

Improvements could be made to the Northern end of the car park in relation to playground facilities and tables and seating. Our recommendation would be redeveloping the existing play area and the old chess area, and maybe extending into a small amount of the parking space at that end to build picnic tables etc.

Summary:

We believe that many of the outcomes of the plan could be meet by revitalizing the facilities directly north of the existing car park without needing to remove such a major asset to existing business and beach goers. We are strongly against the removal of any more than 10-15% of car parking spaces from the area "Car Park One".

We are happy to meet or be involved in further discussion with yourself or any planning groups.

I would like to take the opportunity you have offered to comment on the plan for Cottesloe Car Park One and request that you take the below into consideration.

Alfresco dining seating:

Given John Street and Warnham ends are sided by two restaurants or bars (respectively currently Amberjacks and CBH and CBH and Canteen Pizza), I think offering them the possibility of Alfresco dining is acceptable, providing strict adherence to restricted hours and noise.

However, the alfresco suggested on Overton Gardens in what is currently the centre reservation is unacceptable as it is right in front of a residence of apartments (

), two thirds of which having their windows, balconies and bedrooms facing toward Overton. The alfresco seating (assumed for the benefit of the Cottesloe General Store, of who the owner is one of the owners in the said residential building) would create a lack of privacy as well as a visual and noise disturbance to the residents of the 14 units. Existing corner seating and proposed extended Alfresco at the front of the CGS on Marine Parade seem however a very good idea.

Zone D E and F:

The design, and particularly the plants, planned for these areas should take into consideration the view from the East. Zone D, F and particularly **E** existing trees should **only** be complemented by low shrubs below 1m and/or grassed area, ensuring the existing ocean views are unblocked and uninterrupted all the way from the Civic centre down to the intersection of Marine Parade and Overton Gardens. This will

- support the connection from the Civic Centre to the Foreshore expressed as an aspiration in the Foreshore redevelopment plan, as well as
- ensure the oceanic views that the circa 150 residents along Overton Gardens enjoy (and have paid premium for) are not restricted.

Alternatively, Zone D E and F should be kept as a car park.

if this is fine with you, I would like to qualify my previous comment in relation to the Alfresco area on Overton at the intersection with Marine.

After a discussion with the CGS business owner, it would appear that the drawing provided for community consultation is not an accurate representation of what has been discussed in less public forums on the topic. Specifically, there would be no plan to use the Overton central reservation as "high up" overton as represented, and that the road layout would actually be modified.


In order to be clear, you will find attached a drawing of what I think would be an acceptable plan for all. It extends the existing (green shaded) "alfresco" to a circa 6 times bigger alfresco (red shaded), accounting for pedestrian passage way, and not extending as "high up" Overton so as to be acceptable to residents accross the road. Any higher up Overton and/or bigger would be cause to visual land most likely noise disturbance.

I would also like this Alfresco area to be strictly restricted in perpetuum to day operations until no later than 7pm, and never to be open to the possibility of an alcohol license.

We like the Town of Cottesloe's plan to convert the main carpark at Cottesloe beach to a place for people not for cars. Landscaping with some of our wonderful local plants would be a great idea – they are superbly adapted to our coastal environment, attract birds and lizards and blend in with the nearby dunes. It is also good to see that the dunes will be protected. Cottesloe Coastcare volunteers will be back there planting when the rains arrive!

Two shade trees that would be appropriate for the site are: Rottnest tea tree (Melaleuca lanceolata) and Round leafed moort (Eucalyptus platypus). Eu. platypus naturally occurs between Albany and Esperance but we suggest it would be a suitable small tree for the site, perhaps in a group of three. Both tree species would need to be appropriately shaped and pruned as they grow.

Some resilient local plants which could be used as ground covers include: cushion bush (Leucophyta brownii), Grey cotton heads (Conostylis candicans), Tar bush (Eremophila glabra) and Lepidosperma calcicola (dune sword sedge - a small local sedge). I agree with the suggested closing of Car Park One in order to use this space for events and leisure activities compatible with wellbeing and community building between all age groups AND to improve the visual environment of the Cottesloe foreshore area.

The design should be flexible enough to use the spaces for a wide variety of events, allowing for extension and reduction of enclosed spaces as needed.

The design could allow for spaces to be contained by moveable structures which can be changed when larger spaces are required for special events (i.e. storytelling/ dance/choir/yoga/physical skills).

The design needs to be part of a master plan for the entire foreshore - incorporating additional sporting/leisure activity facilities, walking and cycling paths, pop-up retail and al fresco dining. The design to allow for family use both day and night, incorporating excellent night lighting to encourage families to use the space after dark.

I agree with drop-off temporary parking being permitted on the western side of Marine Parade.

If additional al fresco dining venues are incorporated in the foreshore plan, there will be increased demand for street parking facilities.

The Closure of Car Park One will bring consternation to drivers who have become accustomed to easy beach access. Alternatives need to be developed quickly. I believe that Car Park Two redevelopment must be planned and agreed well in advance of the closure of Car Park One.

How to provide adequate alternative parking? It appears that we need to change Car Park Two into a multi level, below-ground car park.

I agree with the sketched 'possible' bicycle access path route and separate pedestrian path.

Encouraging young people to use the beachfront for sporting and leisure activities day and evening will enliven the beachfront and link the north and south areas of the beach. Specific areas need to set aside for the activities.

I'd welcome the addition of casual eating and drinking venues on both sides of Marine Parade, whether for summer season only or all year around.

Given that a high percentage of visitors to Cottesloe beach are not part of the Cottesloe community it is reasonable to assume that State Government funding will be available. However does the State Government have available funds?

The Cottesloe beach foreshore area has a negative visual impact. It looks tired. It looks shabby.

It needs re-invigorating, it needs variety and it requires an overall redesign plan to be agreed in advance so changes can be implemented without ongoing delays at every stage or progress.

The beach is constantly being eroded as sand is taken out by the sea. This is evidenced by collapsing walkways and unstable areas. We urgently need a well thought out plan to support the dunes and slow down ocean ingress. This needs to be integral to any development plans for the western side of Marine Parade.

COTTESLOE FORESHORE RENEWAL CARPARK No1

1. The loss of the parking places that result from the elimination of Car Park No 1 will impact on parking in adjacent streets, especially during the summer months and when events are held at the beach. It cannot be left to the usual 'wait and see' approach. On past experience the Cottesloe Rangers would need expert input to equip them for the task of directing traffic to Napier Street Car Park and ensuring that street parking and overflow parking to the Broome street verge does not occur.

There may be a need to negotiate with the for Golf Club for use of land at the Forrest Street/ Marine parade junction and with the Cottesloe Surf Club for land east of the Club House which is already used for car parking.

2. The Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Master Plan speaks of the need for *al fresco* dining areas on Marine Parade. This is obviously a sensible move to allow the businesses fronting Marine Parade to get maximum opportunity to service patrons visiting the beach. However the Car Park No 1 Opportunities Plan shows *al fresco* areas in Warnham Road, John Street and Overton Gardens. Given the area is overwhelmingly residential and given the protests from residents that will inevitably result if *al fresco* areas are permitted in these streets, why not eliminate the *al fresco* areas from these streets and instead maximise *al fresco* areas on Marine Parade? Such a change would save a considerable amount of Council staff time.

As the Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Master Plan indicates a realignment of Marine Parade that would increase the area available for *al fresco* use by commercial outlets, why not implement that change together with the Car Park No 1 Opportunities Plan?

- 3. Zones B to E do not seem to correlate with the Cottesloe Foreshore
 Renewal Master Plan suggestions for these areas and the descriptions in the spatial arrangements
 are too vague to form any opinion about their adequacy or otherwise.

I note that additional formalised parking now exists on Forrest and Napier Streets and the existing Napier Street Car Park is full on hot days or event days in Cottesloe.

I would like this precinct design to consider how it will relate to the proposed Ocean Pool and Boardwalk that has been submitted as part of the Foreshore Master Plan in the North (South of Barchetta). This will need the proposed extra parking in this Napier St car park and it is also a way to justify State and Federal Govt funding for this purpose. The wider area North and South of the car park will ensure the best possible integration and use of this facility into the overall foreshore masterplan. SPREADING useage of the beach and foreshore from central to North Cottesloe should be a priority.

A redesign of the existing terraces and the dune zone can create a better, safer, sustainable and well used terrace with its spaces as this is the best overall long term design and community use outcome. This also decreases the wear and tear on Community infrastructure in the central Cottesloe zone.

The design should focus on what Cottesloe should have for the next 50 years.

At a minimum i think street parking on the East side of Marine Parade is doable, but again only if the Napier St car park is developed properly over 2 levels. The full, development of the Napier Street car park really frees up the full Boulevard to all walking, running and CYCLING. Making it uneccessary to park on the west side of Marine Parade.

It makes this area a better space for all residents and Visitors over the longer term.

I request the Council progress the redevelopment of Car Park 2 (near Napier St) as the next stage of work to be considered. This should be fast tracked and funding applications made for the works. I would like to see the carpark area moved onto the Road reserve by 10-15 metres so you could have some commercial fronts on the lower level of the 2 storey carpark (which would not conflict with the 'Reserve')

This may include additional underground car parking, development of community spaces, open spaces and possible commercial uses on the site as per the original Enquiry by Design and the Cott Plus plan. Federal Funding is available for this sort of project and we should chase it whilst we have the Government in place now.

I would like two separate paths considered in the design, one as a wider pedestrian promenade, and the other as a bicycle path to best ensure user safety and reduce user conflict. Referencing the expansion of the Napier

St car park mentioned above allows us to have less parking on Marine Parade.

The North Cottesloe Ocean Pool with its Water Polo facility and its 'Dune Top Walk' provide a much needed boost to the recreational options. This potentially brings "Water Polo By The Sea" to Perth It is worthwhile for the plan to accommodate numerous activities to promote a healthy lifestyle. This facility keeps younger children swimming in salt water and older and disabled citizens with a safe salt water experience.

I would like the redevelopment to include a new active recreation zone with a play/skate/multi-use sports court. This could be further North as well.

Please include more alfresco dining on the East side of Marine Parade and adjoining side streets, including closure of some street parking bays if required or relocation of existing taxi, bus, loading bays to obtain the best overall result.

Reference again the Napier Street car park as a priority as it is the key to best usage and the best outcomes for the residents and the visitors. Shops on the ground floor joining North (Eric St) to the South (Forrest St) as a place to encourage pedestrian movement on the east side of Marine Parade as people look to eat, shop or generally recreate.

I would like the Council to pursue Regional Grants, State and Federal Government funding as this is an asset that will be utilised by tourists and Non-Cottesloe ratepayers forever. There is also Sports Funding for some of these activities particularly swimming and Water Polo as separate Funding channels.

The Foreshore Master Plan MUST spread to the North, it MUST look at the 2 level development of the Napier St car park.

It must bring in the North Cottesloe Dune Top Walk, Swimming and Water Polo facility as this improves the entrance point to Cottesloe. Most notably it improves your sources of funding!

Thank you for the invitation to comment on the concept for beach Carpark 1.

In general I support the carpark spaces being turned over to public use.

However I was present when the late Dr Linley Lutton, at the Enquiry by Design forum in 2007, explained his reasons for including a very limited number of car spaces on the waterfront.

He rightly noted that visits to Cottesloe Beach are entirely weather-driven. Basically, carparks fill up on hot summer mornings and begin to empty as the sea breeze blows hard and people leave the beach.

Remaining cars are there for the hospitality venues, which are very poorly supported on wintery days.

However Dr Lutton correctly identified another category of beach visitors: people who like to sit in their cars on winter days, even in big storms, and from this refuge watch the wrath of the sea. I have noticed this on many walks along the beachfront, summer and winter, night and day, and seen how much pleasure the practice brings. Many are regulars.

They bring coffee or fish and chips and enjoy the beach and seascape. In winter they have no trouble snaring a front-row carpark. Some are elderly and disabled, others include younger couples. It is a very valuable social amenity.

All this would be lost were the entire carpark to close.

Dr Lutton suggested that a "dress circle" for such parked cars be created, but lowered by perhaps a metre so that people on foot behind can see over the vehicles.

This height might have to be adjusted as so many people now drive four-wheel drive vehicles.

Another such popular spot was lost forever when Van Eileen, between the two hotels, and its surrounding car-par were closed and converted to laws.

I hope you will consider including this idea in the plan.

This could be parking on the western side of Marine Pde and the retention of a small amount of parking at the northern end of the existing main carpark. In addition, Napier St carpark should be developed - underground parking would be ideal. expensive.

Should parking along the west side of the existing car park be turned into 90 degree parking (designed to allow enough room to reverse out safely) to increase capacity? Mayor Angers – many thanks for your prompt reply.

We did not contact the police. We monitored the incident carefully for over an hour and could see that the gathering was beginning to disperse about 11pm. We believe we saw a police van circle the car park and then remain stationery on Marine Parade, so they may well have been aware of the 'event'. We did witness a car reverse into a motor cycle with a fairly loud crash, and a tow truck had to be called.

As you appreciate, the problem is that there was probably nothing illegal in the strict sense, but it was certainly anti-social and menacing. You may be interested to note that the Hon J R Quigley MLA reported similar concerns in Scarborough some years ago:

'I draw the House's attention to the social problem that is occurring in Scarborough with the onset of summer and the appearance in Scarborough of a large number of vehicles. They are small Japanese cars that look a bit smaller than Escorts and have exhaust pipes about six inches in diameter. I am sure that some members will have seen these on the roads. They gather in car parks on Scarborough beachfront, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights and Sunday afternoon. I notice that they also seem to congregate outside my electorate, at the northern side of

Herdsman Lake near the Powis Street exit before driving to Scarborough. They arrive in significant numbers. I have seen them in Reserve Street car park from about 7.30 on Friday night. They appear to be menacing merely because of their numbers, but they are not breaking the law. As the night goes on, the occupants participate in what are known as boot parties in which they drink alcohol taken from the boots of cars. The smokies then start and the police arrive, but of course as soon as the police come the vehicles exit via the three exits of the car park. When the police apprehend the drivers, they are faced with two difficulties. They issue a traffic infringement notice. From the looks of some of the offenders, they probably screw it up and put it in the ashtray. They seem to have little regard for the notices that are issued because the conduct just continues. On the occasions when traffic police have effected arrests, they have then had to leave the area with those they have arrested and have been absent from Scarborough beachfront for some time while they process the arrest. It means that the occupants' associates and cohorts can continue unbridled.'

The presence of probably 150 high powered vehicles in the No 2 Car Park on Saturday night, revving their engines and flashing their lights in the presence of large numbers of people milling around certainly appeared somewhat threatening and we

would not want the car park to become a regular centre for this type of activity. The cars left in convoys and at great speed. Mr Quigley referred to these sort of problems some years ago in Scarborough as set out above and this appears

to have provided or at least contributed to the impetus for a general improvement of the Scarborough beachfront in particular.

We were not aware that the car park is subject to surveillance by CCTV.

As you may know we have already received a prompt response from Sandra Boulter who advocates a comprehensive parking and traffic management plan.

The No 2 Car Park is too big, it attracts anti-social behaviour, - scores of people using the bushes as a toilet) and it is an environmental eyesore.

With the proposed changes to the No 1 Car Park and the reduction in car spaces, we are very concerned that the problems with the No 2 Car Park will only increase.

Cottesloe should be adopting the aims of the Scarborough Beach Redevelopment which aims...

'to achieve a pedestrian friendly environment with emphasis on walking, cycling and public transport... endeavouring to deliver new infrastructure that will help realise this shift to more sustainable modes of transport.'

The TOC cannot charge fees for parking and it seems unreasonable for rate payers to continue to provide significant areas of free parking, in what is after all a residential area. If Cottesloe is to provide parking for tourists and visitors, more emphasis should be placed on placing those facilities away from the centre and into the 'wings' of Cottesloe, such as happens in (for example) Byron Bay and Noosa.

The No 2 Car Park should be reduced in size (preferably scrapped altogether!), properly landscaped and designed so as to prevent and discourage the sort of anti-social behaviour we witnessed on Saturday night.

Such a design should also include the blocking off of access to the car park from Bryan Way, and limiting the access between Broome Street and Marine Parade down Bryan Way to pedestrians only.

Dear Mr Angers

We have been in touch with you before concerning the No 2 Car Park. We are residents of adjacent to the No 2 Car Park.

This Saturday night we were very concerned with the goings on in the car park. We were alerted by noise and headlights directly into our house, and on investigation saw that the car park was virtually full with cars circling the car park, revving their engines, and large groups of young people milling around and relieving themselves in the dunes. Eventually about 11pm they dispersed, again revving their engines, and exiting the car park down Bryan Way at speed, and screaming along Marine Parade, or up Napier Street and sounding their horns.

The whole episode was disconcerting and menacing, and we as residents were disturbed by the lights and the noise.

We have been away for a month so do not know if this has occurred on recent nights in January, but we would be very distressed if this is to be a regular event.

It is just one more reason to reduce the size of the No 2 Car Park, or replace it entirely with grass areas. It is an anti-social space at the best of times and should be scrapped for more family friendly recreational space with parking confined to the wings of Cottesloe.

With the proposed changes to the No 1 Car Park we are anxious that the No 2 Car Park does not become the default parking area for Cottesloe. We are subjected to anti-social behaviour as it is, and have to suffer the resultant litter in the car park at weekends, when for the most part this is an unused environmentally unsound heat stand.

As we have advocated in the past, we would strongly recommend closing Bryan Way to cars and closing that entrance to the Car Park altogether. We also have requested creating a landscaped barrier for residents of Bryan Way and continuing the path from Bryan Way in front of our house all the way down to Marine Parade.

As an avid (slow) cyclist and a regular visitor to Cottesloe, I strongly support this viewpoint. Cycling along Marine Parade at the moment is dangerous wherever you go. If you go on the road, you run the risk of car doors opening (has happened to me a number of times), you hold up traffic and cars often pass way too close. It's terrifying. If you go on the 'shared' path along the beachfront, it becomes chaotic. I know I have to give way to pedestrians and do so, but they resent you being there and on busy days it's almost impossible to ride on the shared path. My husband and I often end up walking our bikes along there.

Having two distinct and separated pathways - one for (slow) cyclists and one for pedestrians - would alleviate much of this and encourage people to ride their bikes to the beach thereby alleviating parking problems. By 'slow' I do not include the large groups of high speed riders in pelatons - to be fair you rarely see these groups on Marine Parade as it's not the place for them, but designing this are with cyclists in mind is a no brainer.

It is worthwhile for the plan to accommodate numerous activities to promote a healthy lifestyle.

Given that one of the main objections of replacing the present car park with greenery & creating multi-use areas may be the loss of approx 80 carbays right on the beach. People do like parking as close to the facilities as possible.

Might I make the suggestion that by..... sinking the present car park..... so that it is below street level ,yet still above storm surge levels , the beach going public will retain the use of the bays and have easy access to the beach from the lower level.

The concrete slab, forming the roof of the car park could be so formed, that dwarf pine trees may be planted into specially constructed wells (so the roots do not disturb the foundations).

As a Cottesloe resident and daily beach walker/swimmer (at dog beach), I am very happy at the proposal to remove the carpark No.1. I am hopeful that future plans might also include the redevelopment of the Napier Street carpark to include underground paid parking for visitors and more restaurants and amenities to keep Cottesloe an exciting and vibrant destination.

I would also like to see more al fresco dining opportunities for restaurants, and hopefully removal of car parking along the Eastern side of Marine Parade too. My hope is that the area becomes an exciting destination for visitors and locals wanting a destination at night to wander along a boardwalk and choose from many small boutique restaurants and cafes. Ideally high end, casual and in between, so there is a choice. I don't want to see just one or two massive ugly concrete restaurants, but more of a range of places so that we don't just get one or two overpriced options with a monopoly on the area.

In regards to payment for parking, I think the council needs to seriously consider it. The reality is that most residents who use the beach on a daily basis go early in the morning so car parking for them is not an issue (plus they mostly walk), and before 7.30/8am, parking should be free. I do feel that people using the beach during the day and in the evening should pay for parking and this especially includes tourist buses that use bus bays. There are plenty of places to see the ocean for free, but I think Cottesloe foreshore in the future will be something much more than just a place to go to/view the beach.

In terms of the high-rise issues, I would just like to say that we have spent too much time talking about height restrictions and have lost sight of what's important- good thoughtful town planning. Whatever happens to height I am not as bothered as by the thought of getting ugly cheap buildings with no green space/ trees/ gardens to offset them.

Thank you for dropping into our business regarding the above mention plan. Sorry we missed you. We have viewed the plan on the website.

Background:

We have owned and operated Amberjacks for over 10 years now. We have experienced the business highs of Daylight Savings time, and more recently the tougher economic situation in WA over the last few years. I can safely say that the possibility of losing Car Park One would have a greater impact on our business than either of these events.

We will offer feedback from both a business viewpoint and residents viewpoint:

Business Feedback:

From experience of having the car park closed all day for several years on the 31st of December, we can detail a loss of 50% of turnover compared to the years when the car park remained open.

A large proportion of our customers utilize the convenience of close parking proximity when making a choice to come to our venue.

We purchased the business for a significant amount of money. The value of our asset is directly linked to the high turnover of revenue. Losing this parking lot would significantly affect our business asset to such an extent that the flow on result for our family would be the need to suddenly reconsider our ability to afford living arrangements within the local area.

In relation to staff retention (which our business relies heavily on), the feedback from our staff is that ease of close parking access is a considerable factor in working at our venue.

Residential Feedback:

Pressure on parking availability can be significant at peak times. Already cars spreading up into the residential streets is a problem. Removing the main car park would only add to this problem. I can not imagine how the streets would cope during Sculptures by the Sea, if carpark one was removed. It would be a disaster with complaints from every resident living anywhere near the beach.

Opportunities:

In regards to the development of grass areas, plants and trees - our observation is that the existing grass areas in front of our business and on the southern side of Indiana's are not overly pressured. There is plenty of shade from sun and still bad wind.

Feedback needs to be obtained from the key stake holders, principally the businesses on Marine Parade; and nearby residents who would be directly affected. Others are the Surf Club and people with impaired mobility. Councillors should be advised of the names and positions of persons consulted and what their response was.

This information should be presented in the form of a written impact statement ito be provided to Councillors, and preferably made available to rate payers.

(I would see key stakeholders being beach and carpark users, car park businesses who would be affected by the closure, Cottesloe Surf Club, ratepayers, .

(I spoke to the Manager/Owner of the Deli on the corner of Overton who responded "Bring it on! - the parking will sort itself out" .)

2/ THE CAR PARK #1 REDESIGN.

Council should consider a staged redevelopment. Say stage 1 landscape Zones B and E. Upgrade the balance say 50% of the existing area to a more attractive car park, with the ability to use the space for community events, markets etc. Having seen how stage 1 performs, the development of the balance would be enhanced.

I have looked at the Emerge Plan on the web site. It looks feasible. I would recommend that expenditure be reasonably confined to major and long term aspects for the first stage. Option B of the three levels proposed by Emerge seems reasonable. (I note that this is supported by the Cottesloe Ratepayer Association.)

It would be nice to see something a innovative and quirky which would complement Cottesloe's "quirky and eclectic Sense of Place". This is a major component in what makes Cottesloe an attractive suburb. The Indiana is a good example. People like something different.

OTHER

Disabled parking be well provided for as together with a compliant path to the beach level and also good access from the north side to the disabled toilets under the Indiana (already requested by the Disability Committee)

Marine Parade be made pedestrian friendly- kerb-less, paved with stone a la Claremont's Bay View Terrace (worth spending money on)

I endorse the widening of the Eastern sidewalk with the inclusion of al fresco areas and parklets.

It is essential that the new work be performed to a high standard, equivalent to that of the City Centre. Council should be able to obtain grants for specific facilities eg disabled form government/public bodies. Corporates or individuals may be persuaded to sponsor or otherwise contribute to sculptures, furniture etc. I believe that community would be prepared to agree to a special levy to improve the beach front provided they feel it is worthwhile.

I would recommend that Councillors focus on the major issues above, and leave the detailed design to the experienced professionals in Emerge.

Options

<u>I do not support Option B \$995,900 which was recommended by Councillors (Minutes meeting 12th December 2017).</u>

This option includes further "recreational facilities" (various) plus "Off The Shelf Furniture." Two points - the designated Zone E is currently a high activity area; and "Off The Shelf Furniture" would be a gross waste of ratepayers money in this marine environment.

My preference is Option C \$1,194,875 with the deletion of:

- a). "recreation facility" As above Option B
- b). "water-play" area. Over a period of years WA has suffered from severe water shortages.

Closing comments

Marine Parade is predominantly a high volume traffic area so all planning must be carefully structured

The existing nearby infrastructure also needs to be upgraded with any new additions/alterations designed to integrate with the planned development of car park no.1.

A Landscape architect should be appointed to oversee this project such as seen at Coogee Beach designed by Bruce Mackenzie in the 1980's and completed in 1993. This design and infrastructure has withstood the test of time.

TRAFFIC - as there is no proposed road realignment or traffic calming measures in place high priority must be considered by staff and councillors as to how to deal with this issue.

SUBMISSION ON COTTESLOE CAR PARK ONE OPPORTUNITIES PLAN

We are residents who live 30 metres from The Beachfront and present this submission to comment on areas shown on the latest Cottesloe Foreshore "mud map" obtained from Council.

The Council's mud map is very vague and most unsatisfactory with broad brush headings describing expected activities in the shown areas.

We don't think that Council has given out sufficient information for the Public to comment on this but after having read items in November and December Council Minutes applying to the Foreshore and the previous proposal I will comment on what we can see and take it from there, our opinions as follows:

In it's present form COTTESLOE BEACH area has CHARM, CHARACTER, EASE OF ACCESS, ALL OF THE AMENITIES ONE NEEDS FOR A DAY AT THE BEACH AND ABOVE ALL A LAID BACK QUIET VILLAGE ATMOSPHERE, WHICH LOCALS, THE POPULATION OF PERTH AND INTERNATIONAL VISITORS ALIKE ADORE THE WAY IT IS IN IT'S PRESENT FORM.

DON'T THROW THE BABY OUT WITH THE BATH WATER.

We all can see that the no 1 Car Park and other items stated in The Opportunities Plan are badly in need of maintenance but we do need to excercise caution in not destroying the character and charm of the place AND THE ACCESSIBILITY.

Consequently for a TRIAL, We are of the strong belief that Council should initially experiment with the SOUTHERN HALF OF THE CAR PARK ONLY.

REASONS BEING:

THE NORTHERN HALF OF THE CAR PARK SURFACE is in much better condition than the Southern Half and could be temporarily repaired for around \$15,000.00.

This would be a massive saving, ALMOST HALVE THE INITIAL COST and would also allow objective evaluation of the experiment before deciding to destroy the whole Car Park.

If the decision was made at a later date to take up the Northern Half of the Car Park as well, it could be done with the money saved by not doing it in the first place.

THIS WOULD ALSO ALLOW THE EXPERIMENT TO BE MADE FOR LITTLE MORE THAN HALF OF THE INITIAL ESTIMATED COST.

ZONE E We are very concerned over the prospect of having the proposed ACTIVE RECREATION (WHICH INCLUDES PLAY/SKATE/MULTI USE SPORTS COURT/BASKETBALL) on our doorstep.

opposite the bottom of Overton Gardens, and am amazed that Council would even consider this option so close to and (LESS THAN 30 METRES FROM NEARBY RESIDENCES).

We all know how noisy and invasive the activities in Skate Parks and Basketball Courts can be and to propose such a thing in a RESIDENTIAL AREA is TOTALLY INCONSIDERATE OF LOCAL RESIDENTS AND WOULD SEVERELY AFFECT AND DIMINISH THE PEACE, WELL BEING AND AMENITY OF NEARBY RESIDENTS.

IT IS MINUTED IN COUNCIL MINUTES, 28 November 17, item 10.1.7, that in feasibility studies conducted by both Town of Cottesloe and City of Stirling, to locate a Skate Park any closer than 100 metres from a Residential Area is highly undesirable and not acceptable.

Also in those minutes it states that "works would require planning approval from WA Planning Commission but changes are minimal and do not significantly alter the purpose of the area".

I TOTALLY DISAGREE WITH THIS CONCLUSION BECAUSE THE CHANGES ARE SIGNIFICANT AND DO VERY MUCH ALTER THE PURPOSE ESPECIALLY IN THE PROPOSED ZONE E.

CONSEQUENTLY WE STRONGLY AND INDIGNANTLY OBJECT TO THE WHOLE CONCEPT OF ZONE E BEING LOCATED IN OUR RESIDENTIAL AREA.

If we must have such a facility, THE BEACH SIDE OF MARINE PARADE OPPOSITE THE CENTRE OF CAR PARK 2 WOULD BE A SATISFACTORY SITE.

In Council minutes regarding selection for location of a Skate Park that site was rejected stating that the position is only 85m from residences but I measured it on Google and also stepped it out and it seems more like over 100m each way from houses, taking the diagonal to the Beach side of Marine Parade, so it is worth checking.

PROPOSED EVENT SPACE, MARKET SERIES, LOCAL MUSICIANS AND STREET PERFORMERS, POSTCODE PARTIES and JAZZ SESSIONS to my mind means UNCONTROLLED NOISE in a RESIDENTIAL AREA.

WE ALSO CONSIDER THAT TOWN OF COTTESLOE HAS AN OBLIGATION TO PROTECT THE AMENITY AND WELL BEING OF NEARBY RESIDENTS AND ACCESS TO THEIR PROPERTIES.

WE THINK THAT WE SHOULD LEAVE THE BEACH AREA TO BE USED IN IT'S PRESENT LAID BACK FORM AND ATMOSPHERE WHICH HAS BEEN SO SUCCESSFUL AND IS SO POPULAR!

WE DON'T WANT TO IMITATE CALIFORNIA, SYDNEY, GOLD COAST OR ANY OTHER PLACE. COTTESLOE HAS UNIQUE CHARM AND WE NEED TO KEEP IT THAT WAY.

HERITAGE: Council is obligated to consult THE HERITAGE COUNCIL before making any alterations around INDIANA TEA ROOMS.

CABANA SHELTERS ARE PART OF THE CHARM OF COTTESLOE, ARE VERY PRACTICAL PROVIDE DEEP SHADE AND SHELTER FROM RAIN AND ONLY NEED BRUSHWOOD ROOVES PUT ON THE EXISTING ROOFS TO UPGRADE THEM.

IN CONCLUSION in my opinion we recommend that Council:

- 1 REMOVE THE SOUTHERN HALF OF CAR PARK 1 AND PUT IN PLACE LAWN, COVERED PICNIC SEATING AND SHELTER, WIND BREAKS AND BARBECUES.
- 2 TEMPORARILY REPAIR THE NORTHERN HALF OF CAR PARK 1
- 3 RETAIN ACCESSIBLITY

- 4 KEEP ANY CHANGE WITHIN THE CONCEPT OF THE EXISTING STYLE AND CHARM.
- 5 CONSULT HERITAGE COUNCIL OVER REMOVAL OF INDIANA'S PERGOLA AND SURROUNDS
- 6 ZONE E: COUNCIL HAS AN OBLIGATION TO CONSIDER THE EFFECT OF ANY CHANGES AND ADDITIONS ON THE WELL BEING AND AMENITY OF NEARBY RESIDENTS.

THE PROPOSED ACTIVITIES IN ZONE E- (SKATE PARK, BASKETBALL COURT AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES) are TOTALLY UNSUITABLE FOR THAT AREA IN THAT SITUATION BECAUSE IT IS FAR TOO CLOSE TO NEARBY RESIDENTIAL FOR THESE PURPOSES.

- *Plus 80% of carpark users are not Cottesloe residents/ratepayers.Get a 50% contribution from the State Govt (e.g. Scarborough) or leave well enough alone.
- *Perth people are great car users and public transport access from neighbouring suburbs is poor at best. Removal of the #1 car park may well reduce rather than increase the number of beach visitors. The views of the businesses opposite should be canvassed and considered.

- *This is a good opportunity to consider treatment of Marine Parade to create a slower zone between Napier and Forrest St.
- *Widen the dual use bike path and incorporate nodes along it for people who want to talk to friends to get out of the way of those moving, especially bike riders.

For the Zones;

It is difficult to comment on a vague plan such as this, with no detail or costings. It would have less ambiguous if the questions had been posed:

- (A) Do you support the retaining of the carpark
- (B) do you support the removal of the carpark?
- (C) do you support partial removal of carpark?
- (D) would you support the carpark being replaced by trees and grass?
- (E) would you support the carpark being replaced with (a) recreation zones (b) community gathering space (c) elevated community seating.

MY COMMENTS:

- 1. Removing the carpark should not be seen as an opportunity to 'develop' manufactured facilities on the beachfront.
- 2. Cottesloe beach has its own character. It is known as a natural, unspoilt beach which is why it is so popular. Improvements and maintenance to fencing, lighting, the dual-use path, vegetation and existing seating are all that are needed. Any additions must be in keeping with the unique beachfront character.
- 3. The prominent and ugly signage needs to be completely overhauled and replaced with minimal, unobtrusive signs.
- 4. The plan to remove the carpark altogether, infers that the beach is for residents only and removes the provision of parking for visitors such as the elderly, small children and the disabled.
- 5. I support the removal of perhaps half of the carpark, replacing it with trees and grass.
- 6. Professional plans for the foreshore have previously been accepted by the community. I object to the expense of employing multiple consultants to override those plans, including those that have provided for this community comment exercise which has no details or costs.
- 7. The only installations that should be considered are those which require minimum maintenance and will last long-term.

FURTHER:

ZONE A - BEACH INTERFACE ZONE. I support this being a grassed area with limestone walls for seating.

ZONE B ELEVATED COMMUNITY SEATING ZONE. ???? Unnecessary - I support grass and trees and limestone walls for seating.

<u>ZONE C - PASSIVE RECREATION ZONE</u> - I support casual, in-character seating on grass, with trees for shading

ZONE D - CENTRAL COMMUNITY GATHERING SPACE. Amalgamate with (B) and (C) - trees, grass and barbecues. <u>NO POP-UP ANYTHING, NO ARTIFICIAL SHADING.</u>

ZONE E - ACTIVE RECREATION ZONE - NO RECREATION FACILITIES, NO PLAY/SKATE/MULTI-USE COURTS!!

The "active recreation zone" is the beach - for swimmers, paddlers, snorkellers, walkers, joggers.

ZONE F - POSSIBLE RECONSIDERATION OF EXISTING CHESS AMPHITHEATRE. I am ambivalent.

NODAL POINT LOOKOUTS X3. Unnecessary and out of character. Consultants' folly.

Suggestions of pop-up events and markets consider current trends rather than a long-term view and are not appropriate for our beachfront. It has been mentioned that the Council would PAY for such vendors. It should be the other way round!

The Civic Centre is a perfect venue for pop-up events and markets. With its lawns and trees it's a perfect meeting-place for people to meet for Sunday brunches. It is under-utilised. This should be actively pursued.

As an owner occupier I have observed Cottesloe Council continuously accept money in lieu of parking spots in redevelopment or new developments along Marine Parade with the consequent greater demand on Overton Gardens street parking.

Now a "senior" citizen my visitors fall mainly into two categories...... "oldies" who have to park "somewhere" and face a walk, and grandchildren (particularly grand daughters) who have to park anywhere up to the Napier Street Parking area for an overnight stay. Congratulations on continuing to progress planning for the foreshore upgrade.

I am keen to see the revised Cottesloe foreshore masterplan to show the overall design vision. As you know, I am hoping this will provide a modern, unique and world class upgrade to complement the beach. This masterplan is a crucial document to guide the foreshore redevelopment, provide a budget and identify the timing/stages for this major project. This can then be used to help source funds (including grants, Government funding and private donors).

Releasing the carpark area for other uses provides a very valuable opportunity to incorporate the planning for this area into the broader masterplan. As part of this, my comments on the car park area are:

- 1. Parking I believe that some parking needs to retained on the beachfront for seniors, people with prams and disabled bays. These people should be given the priority to park very close to the beach as they will find it more difficult to walk up the hills and/or be further distance from the beach if parking up Napier and Forrest streets. Many friends and neighbours are concerned they not be able to access the beach as easily if they are older or they take multiple young children to the beach. I think we want the beach to continue to be easily accessed by all
- 2. Toilets installing a new toilet block as part of the public space. Currently, many people using this area have to use the Beaches cafe toilets especially if you have young children at the playground.
- 3. Widening the separate pedestrian and cycle paths is important through this area
- 4. Including public gathering spaces, picnic spaces, active areas, an all abilities/ages playground (for all ages and abilities including adults and older children)
- 5. Creating amazing landscaping, shading, seating and outlook areas. Connections to the beachfront area are very important
- 6. Creating a design connection between the foreshore and Cottesloe Civic linking these two unique public spaces for all to enjoy
- 7. Upgrading the Napier St car park to help overflow parking and design a new retail strip fronting Marine Parade from that carpark. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Car Park Opportunities Plan. In this regard, we note that the notice on Council's website is a little confusing, advising that the plan is being advertised for 14 days commencing 29 January and submissions closing on 9 February, some 12 days later.

Notwithstanding the above confusion, we generally support the direction of the Opportunities Plan and feel that it should be more comprehensive and consider foreshore land all the way up to North Cottesloe. It seems that there is an attempt to squeeze every possible activity into the relatively small car park area making it overly intensive.

In terms of intensity, the most commercially intensive area of the foreshore is that strip from Forrest Street to Warnham Road (both sides). North of the northern alignment of Warnham Road, the predominant land use is residential and this factor needs to be taken into careful consideration.

Before discussing specifics in greater detail, as a generalisation, the use of the major recreational resource, the actual beach and ocean seems to take second place to the development of land based activities. As anybody who regularly uses the beach/ocean will be able to identify, showering/foot washing facilities are grossly in adequate, access from the bitumen path to the beach in front of the Indiana Tearooms is very poor if not dangerous, particularly for the elderly and the bitumen paths all the way along the beach in front of Indiana and the Number One Car Park are in very poor states of repair. Aggregate protrudes through the bitumen making walking in bare feet difficult. Showering/foot washing facilities serving the walkway identified in front of Zone C are sorely needed. Many aspects of the plan seem to be divorced from the actual use of the beach/ocean. The beach/ocean should be front and centre of the plan. Provision for cyclists to park cycles and access the beach, as well as over coming elevational differences for parents with prams/pushers and toddlers seems to be ignored.

Along with the general concern about over intensive use of a relatively small area, we are particularly concerned with the proposed active recreation area at Zone E. This seems misplaced adjacent to a predominantly residential area and if developed as a skate board park needs acoustic analysis at the very least. However, as discussed earlier, a broader approach to planning would probably see this relocated further north as a continuation of the existing play zone, in front of the Number Two Car Park where impacts on residents would be minimised.

With further regard to the greater residential character of the northern part of the foreshore area, the location and height of planting and structures needs to be carefully considered to maintain residential amenity and to ensure that residents overlooking proposed new public areas and the actual beach can see what is going on in line with principles for designing out crime. The more dense vegetation is and the less transparent structures are, so the potential for social misdemeanour increases. Over recent years, Council has effectively closed down the Number One Car Park on New Years Eve for this very reason attesting to the fact that anti-social behaviour on beach fronts can and does occur. Living adjacent to Marine Parade, we can advise that it is not unusual to hear screams from the beach front in the dead of night, either from people fooling about or in distress and the potential for problems to occur is enhanced where overlooking is diminished. Designing out crime principles need to be strictly followed and views from overlooking residences maintained.

The possible alfresco area at the foot of Overton Gardens should be reconsidered. This is very exposed and a windy spot. Already rubbish from the minimal alfreso area at the Cottesloe General Store is a problem. Much of Overton Gardens is impacted by litter after every weekend. Vermin, in particular crows, pick up food stuffs and spread rubbish over some distance.

We see the Plan representing a positive start in a process for beach front improvement and hopefully public input will help to produce an outcome which improves Cottesloe as a beachside suburb.

During my tenure as mayor of our town we had the benefit of expertise in urban planning which clearly showed that the full closure of carpark No. 1 would have a detrimental impact on the central beachfront, particularly for beachfront businesses in winter months, when the only potential for customers are visitors who park cars in the front row of carpark No.1 looking out to sea.

Whoever prepared your Opportunities Plan does not appear to have had regard to any of that earlier expert input. That input resulted in the earlier plan being to significantly reduce the size of carpark No. 1, not least of all so as to allow a much wider multiple use path to traverse the central beachfront, but at the same time creating a sufficient number of sea facing carbays to remain. The reduced size of the carpark enabled new more usable terraces to replace the existing terraces and allow them to extend eastwards towards Marine Pde.

Most importantly, the reduction of carpark No. 1 was subject to carpark No. 2 first being expanded with additional bays to offset reduction in carpark No. 1.

Your Plan appears driven by savings you hope to make by not resurfacing carpark No. 1, rather than by any overarching vision for the whole beachfront.

I urge you to revisit and incorporate such aspects of the earlier beachfront plans and under no circumstances remove all west facing beachfront carbays.



Submission – Opportunities Plan 2018

Preamble:

Cottesloe Foreshore is a unique place. It is known around the world because of photos that showcase Indiana. To the locals the Cottesloe pylon is a 'heritage' marker.

The Opportunities Plan is just that ... an opportunity Cottesloe Council is taking to establish a high quality re-vamp for car park 1. Cottesloe Council should not pull back into mediocrity because of costs. The benchmark for Cottesloe should be quality design and quality workmanship as is evident at the Esperance foreshore. Bespoke furniture is essential with practical limestone walls for seating, stainless steel fencing and limited but elegant signage that will provide an image that Cottesloe seeks to maintain. Therefore Option C is the preferred option - \$1,194,875 - Include turf, trees (Norfolk Island pines trees), bespoke furniture, irrigation and lighting.

Cottesloe is BEACH. It is already a RECREATION AREA. There should be no need to include a multi-use sports court, water-play facilities and plaza areas that detract from the beach and an unspoiled environment.

Ratepayers generally are concerned by the *Opportunities Plan* mud-map that has little details and no costing. Supplementary parking is an obvious issue.

Opportunities Plan feedback:

- **Zone A** Beach Interface Zone presumably limestone terraces and lawn will remain as is. However, an improved view of the pylon and Rottnest when travelling west down John St would be welcome. (A stately pine tree to replace the rubbish bins?)
- **Zone B** Elevated Community Seating Zone. There are no details on which to make an informed comment. 'Elevated' seating would appear to be unnecessary.
- **Zone C** Passive recreation zone presumably grassed area. Limestone seating around the base of Norfolk Island pine trees would enhance the area.
- **Zone D** Central Community Gathering Space what is the purpose of this? Residents do not want music, noise or entertainment in what is already a busy thoroughfare. Continue the passive recreation zone C into this area. People will gather informally as suits their needs. A designated gathering space appears unnecessary.
- **Zone E** Active Recreation Zone an unnecessary inclusion. Remove from plan.
- Zone F Possible Reconsideration of Existing Chess Amphitheatre the current rotunda
 is an important seating area, close to the existing play area. Its current size is an
 intimate area with uninterrupted views.

Further comments:

- Possible On-street parking as shown along Marine Pde should be short-term parking eg
 'No Standing'/'Drop off only'.
- Consider **traffic calming** for Marine Pde to improve safety for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. Encourage safer, more responsible driving and potentially reduce traffic flow.
- Zone E could become short-term parking (1 hr?)
- **Possible cycle access** as shown should be removed for safety reasons, as cyclist must be separated from pedestrian access.
- Formal cycle access as shown along Marine Pde (separated from pedestrians).
- What is envisaged for the three 'Nodal Point/Lookout' areas? There is no need to provide formal lookouts. People walk and stop according to their own needs. Any formal structure is unnecessary. Keep the pathways open. Remove Nodal Point lookouts from the Opportunities Plan.
- Alfresco seating on Overton Gdns median strip is not supported by residents. Overton Gdns is a busy with traffic both sides of the median strip.

While capital costs may be relatively easy to establish, maintenance and whole of life costs are important factors to consider. Quality infrastructure must reflect the reputation Cottesloe already has as Perth's most popular beach. Off thte shelf furniture is simply not acceptable.

In conclusion:

- Cottesloe is always buzzing with people who want to be part of the wide grassy lawns, the long stretch of white sandy beach, blue water and blue sky. Attracting people to Cottesloe is not difficult.
- Keep the vistas looking west open and clear of structures.
- Replicate the look and feel that is south of Indiana with a similar look and feel north of Indiana – strategically placed Norfolk Island pine trees, grassed areas.
- Less is more do not clutter the area with frenetic activity.

The *Opportunities Plan* mud-map offers little substance on which to make informed comments. Cottesloe Residents and Ratepayers are anticipating further community consultation will take place when plans are refined and detailed costs are applied.

- 1. Repair, expansion and possible realignment of the iconic terrace steps to provide greater capacity for passive use by the public.
- 2. New children's play equipment, possibly more organic nature-based facilities and complete removal of the old structures opposite Beaches Café.
- 3. Consideration of better lighting to allow safe after hours use of the area.
- 4. Consideration of organic spaces for food trucks or events, including Markets.
- 5. Upgraded street furniture, signage and shade structures, as well as BBQ and picnicking areas.
- 6. Support for a multi-use skate park.

Submission on Cottesloe Carpark 1 Opportunities Plan

Dear Sir/Madam

Thank you for the opportunity to make this submission.

I was born in Cottesloe (Devonleigh). Our family lives in Cottesloe. We love Cottesloe and we love living here in our Cottesloe community.

Executive summary

- I support a feasibility study to replace car parking *underneath* the existing Carpark No. 1 by going underground for parking there and keeping the same built envelope as existing, possibly adding cafes within that underground space provided nothing to be built beyond or above the existing Carpark 1 level/dimensions/envelope;
- I do <u>not</u> support any future redevelopment of existing Carpark 2 (and John Black Dune Park), other than the planting of more trees there.

Background

Cottesloe has succeeded in continuing to remain (in my eyes) one of the world's greatest beachside places to play, relax and re-charge.

For me, highest by a long way at the top of the list of reasons for loving Cottesloe are our open spaces and low-key beachside atmosphere.

Whilst I can appreciate there is an attraction in potentially creating more open community space by removing Carpark 1, it is appearing to me more and more of late that this potential Carpark 1 removal is potentially being sought to be linked one way or another to a broader agenda to then seek to replace the existing open Carpark 2 (and the John Black Dune Park) with commercial multi-storey parking and commercial retail and short stay accommodation development.

With the information presently available I would **not support** any future redevelopment of existing Carpark 2 (and John Black Dune Park), and instead would consider planting more trees in that Carpark 2 to enhance the existing space.

It follows I am concerned that Council not make decisions now with Carpark 1 as would then potentially create pressure towards encouraging a future redevelopment of existing Carpark 2 (and John Black Dune Park) to gain back lost parking if Carpark 1 were to be removed.

How then might the community achieve more open community space if it were to support a removal of Carpark 1 in favour of community space, but not then also create pressure towards encouraging a future commercial redevelopment of existing Carpark 2 (and John Black Dune Park)?

I propose that a feasibility should be commissioned by Council to replace car parking *underneath* the existing Carpark No. 1 by going underground for parking there and keeping the same built envelope as the existing.

That would potentially leave open the opportunity for:

- keeping to the same ground level as the already existing Carpark 1 level;
- still changing that Carpark 1 ground level top to new grassed and shaded areas, play areas etc:
- potentially include into the design making the first underground level facing the ocean into cafes and restaurants all with alfresco decks each looking directly out over the beach;
- depending on the number of the car parking levels built below the "underground "café/restaurant level which could be included, the available parking might even increase materially compared to the existing number of bays at the moment in Carpark 1
- help gain sufficient community backing for developing some extra cafes/restaurants in the Carpark 1 location as that would not require the further building out/removal of other existing open spaces nor reducing the existing available car parking in the Carpark 1 area which might potentially hurt the businesses already in the Carpark 1 location.

I understand that this concept may have been tentatively explored about 16 years ago. I gather at that time:

• it may have been thought by some there could be a limestone ridge below the carpark so making excavation difficult – but considering how efficient we are in WA in mining out holes where it is needed, it may well be there could be a right team at a right price who could engineer a large space for developing retail and help make a set-off cost saving all by going down right below the Carpark No 1 existing level with new play parks etc.

- it may have been thought by some that there would not be enough room for both new retail as well as replacement car parking - but that would be surprising since the height of the existing Carpark 1 above the beachfront foot-walk level would appear more than high enough to allow up to 3 levels to be carved back underneath existing Carpark 1;
- it may have been thought by some that there would be areas created that would invite antisocial behaviour – but that argument could also be made just as easily against any multistorey car-parking whether at the beachfront under Carpark 1, at the Carpark 2 area, or anywhere else for that matter.
- It may have been thought that this could be the thin end of the wedge for more development west of Marine Parade - but possibly the community's appetite may have changed over it loost be tested if the commitment is given to the community that such a

project would not be built beyond the existing Carpark 1 dimensions. Apparently the concept
of 16 years ago did not do this, but instead raised existing levels -a new undergrounding
proposal would need to commit to keeping within the same built envelope as the existing.

my opinion on the removal of the carpark 1 in full is that it would be a mistake and parking does need to be satisfied elsewhere. I support a reduction of parking and again feel that the previously mentioned masterplan struck a realistic balance for new parking and reclaimed carpark.

as a committed Cottesloe surfer, I urge the council to consider off peak (winter) user groups as well as the peak use in summer, the elevated carpark and stairs overlooking the main beach does indeed act as a key social grouping area for surfers and other beach usergroups active throughout winter. Removing the carpark would change surfers access and grouping area which needs to be considered and replaced by an improved amenity, it is encouraging that the lookout nodes are highlighted and are a real opportunity for replacing and improving on the grouping areas.

Dear Mat,

I am disconcerted by the constant pressure applied to Admin to 'fix' and or 'change' and or "update" and so on, the remarkable face of the public domain of Cottesloe Beach area which is as everyone knows famously loved and visited precisely because it isn't like any other beach area anywhere in Australia.

There are some reasons to upgrade aspects of the area, and if for example anyone cared to actually note how often carpark 2 is underused, there might be less agitation against grassing carpark one.

- *As regards which, I would like to see grass and trees instead of bitumen so as to expand what is the standout feature of the general area namely grass and trees for sitting on for lying beneath or for lunching or barbecuing on. But please no playground stuff
- *It would be good to see some parking if possible,, but definitely some biking paths, some walking paths, and very much slower cars going through the whole area from Forrest to Eric. If there were more of them, the traffic would automatically be calmed.

Comments re proposed development of Carpark No 1

I do not agree with the proposal as per the 'Opportunities Plan', however, I agree that the current car park is unsightly and requires improvement. I dispute Mayor Philip Angers statement that it "is never fully used except in peak season" as I have often seen it full even at 7am on Friday mornings. The proposal is also at odds with the Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Scheme 2016.

Principally, the proposed scheme ignores the majority of current users who go to Cottesloe Beach to swim, walk the beach and recreate on the sand. I have been doing this with four friends for twenty years, three days a week, Spring Summer and Autumn, plus on other social occasions, and Sculptures by the Sea is always a highlight. As with most users, we do not live within walking distance, but drive, in our case from Shenton Park, and use Carpark No 1. It will also disadvantage the elder and less mobile who can't walk far and who enjoy a view of the ocean from their car, especially in stormy winter weather.

The removal of all parking will change our use pattern and we will probably go somewhere else. Is this what the Council wants?

I have for the past years been noting the general usage of the foreshore precinct and at all times, apart from perhaps during Sculptures by the Sea, there are more people using the beach than the grassed passive and active areas. Does it really need more of this, areas that mostly won't get used?

I believe Carpark No 1 should remain as a significant parking facility, but with a sizable landscaped area facing the ocean, improved and widened pedestrian walkways and greatly enhanced materials. A concept sketch is attached.

The Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Scheme has some worthy ideas, including a realignment between Napier St and Bryan Way, but I believe the design of the roadways is too complicated and fussy. The coffee strip on South Terrace Fremantle is a better approach


It also skirts the issue which would show real vision for Cottesloe. The 'elephant in the room':- the underutilized car park No 2 and the unused and sub-standard John Black Dune Reserve.

This area presents a fantastic opportunity for an entertainment, hospitably, alfresco and restaurant precinct with roof top terraces along the sea front with multi levels of parking cut into the hill behind. Nothing would be lost and so much potential gained. Would it take foresight and strength of character to achieve? Yes of course, but it would be so worth it!

Retention of significant parking at Carpark 1 will benefit most users of Cottesloe Beach and would be necessary during the development of Carpark No 2.

I trust that Council will consider these comments with the aim to achieve a better result for all.

Our comments on the current plan are as below.

Comments on Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal: Carpark Number 1 – Opportunities Plan

These comments are based on the "emerge" drawing with the above title dated 11 December 2017.

Carpark No. 1 is a well-used facility. Its removal will discriminate against visitors who wish to swim and use the beach, which is obviously what most of them come to Cottesloe for. The carpark is also ideally placed for those, including the disabled, who simply want to park and take in the view from this world-renowned beach.

Carpark No. 2 is less convenient for the main beach. However at peak periods both carparks are often full, showing that doing away with carpark No. 1 would further exacerbate the parking problem in the area.

The conversion of on-street parking bays to "alfresco seating" would make things worse, as well as increasing the risk of injury to people seated close to the roadway. Parking in side streets through much of the summer is already an issue and again the proposed plan will make this worse. The Marine Parade carriageway should be maintained at adequate width to allow continuous passage of vehicles, including buses. This stretch has to be recognised as an integral part of an iconic scenic drive.

The need for any different activities in the Carpark No. 1 area has yet to demonstrated.

Our preference is for the carpark to remain in full. There is now adequate funding in Council's budget to allow its resurfacing. More trees could be provided to increase shade. Consideration could be given to capturing carpark runoff in recharge sumps. The existing on-street parking should be allowed to continue.


There is also a need for Cottesloe to provide a decent pool and stimulating playgrounds to cater for everyone especially tourists and locals.

Conversion of Cottesloe beach car park to underground parking with swimming pools & Playground

Vision:

I would like the small car park located opposite Amberjacks and between a children's shady playground and picnic spot and Indiana's, to be converted to:

- 1. 1 or 2 levels of Underground parking (which of course is a shady carpark)
 - a. With easy access to attractive viewing spot
- 2. Above-ground swimming pools with a view of Cottesloe beach surrounded by a non-slip paved area
 - a. 50m lap pool or sandy lagoon similar to the one on Cairns Esplanade http://www.cairns.qld.gov.au/esplanade/facilities/lagoon [Photos]
 - b. a shallow children's pool suitable for children up to 10 years old (with a very shallow end, and a 0.75m end)
 - c. a creative and fun water playground similar to the children's (& teenager's) Darling harbour children's playground in Sydney http://www.darlingquarter.com/play/ [Images]
- 3. a wide paved viewing area under shade cloth

Argument for conversion of beach car park:

- 1. Cottesloe beach is a tourist destination which needs to:
 - a. cater for different needs of travellers
 - b. be beautified
 - c. be made more accessible
 - d. provide convenient viewing and photography lookouts
- 2. The car park is ugly, very hot and unshaded, and
 - a. Is too small to cater for events such as Rottnest swim, Sculpture by the sea, and other potential large public events
 - b. Is used to view the beach, but is not user friendly for contemplating the view, photographing, or sitting in a viewing spot
- 3. Having a pool in the beach carpark saves the reef, beach and popular swimming areas from ridiculous and destructive proposals for swimming pools and replaces a very ugly car park with a beautiful pool or two.

Implementation:

- 1. Use the large carpark on the corner of Napier St and Marine Parade for parking during construction of the underground parking/swimming pool and water play area.

Dear Ms Tyler-Hare,

Thank you for allowing the Cottesloe Beach Hotel to provide feedback on the Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Strategy.

We are enthused by the prospect of the foreshore being renewed. It is commonplace for our staff, visitors and locals to question the main carpark's location, given its exceptional views and height above the beach. It is also apparent the timing is right to improve Cottesloe Beach's facilities and amenities in order to remain world-class.

We hope to see Cottesloe Beach rejuvenated as a premium beachside precinct, befitting of its affluent residential surrounds and significance as a major Western Australian tourist attraction. The beach is an iconic and picturesque destination, thanks to careful preservation and protection. We hope this renewal will only further enhance the area's natural beauty, history and popularity.

We would be thrilled to see the main carpark rezoned for public recreational use and beautified, creating a highly aspirational beachside location. We also believe the space is ideal for sophisticated, civilised events and activations, attracting a mature and family friendly market.

We hope the Cottesloe Beach development will be vastly different to other recent projects in Perth, including Elizabeth Quay, City Beach and the new Scarborough Beach foreshore. It is our hope the new development will be reflective of Cottesloe's upmarket and relaxed environment.

Design:

It is of our concern some of the proposed design elements are short-term trends and will not be timeless and stylish features. Shipping containers, recycled crate furniture, glaring colour schemes, industrial shade structures, tunnel slides and mural to road surfaces, would be out of place and doesn't align with Cottesloe's polished image. We are concerned the proposed design is not reflective of Cottesloe's refined surrounds.

We strongly recommend the murals, petition screenings and artwork displays be replaced with a large and impressive sculpture, which would become an iconic symbol of the area.

We believe the design should strive to showcase the area's natural beauty, harnessing the impressive Norfolk Island Pines and retaining the suburb's classic and elegant identity. The space should be upmarket, relaxed and sophisticated.

It should be noted, as much as the beach should attract tourists and visitors, it should also be inviting for surrounding residents and reflective of their tastes and interests.



Seating and Shade:

We want to ensure the renewal project protects the relaxed beachside lifestyle Cottesloe is renowned for. The new design should enhance our laidback culture for both residents and tourists alike. For example, introducing sun-loungers, daybeds and cabanas with stylish feature umbrellas along Zones A, B and C (See Appendix 1). This would create a holiday-style atmosphere and resort feel, aligning Cottesloe with European beachside destinations.

This relaxed, lounging-style seating would encourage beachgoers to linger in the area for longer, especially when the sea breeze comes in and makes lying on the blowing sand unappealing. Having a comfortable place to relax would potentially encourage people to shop, eat and drink for longer in the area. This beachside resort style atmosphere would also be a point of difference, not seen in any other Perth precinct.

Events, Festivals, Concerts & Shows:

It's the Cottesloe Beach Hotel's belief the existing major ratepayers and operating businesses should be given first opportunity to cater to proposed events and activities. The existing established businesses along Marine Parade should not be disadvantaged during times of change and opportunity, for concepts like food trucks, pop-ups and container businesses that have no long term investment in the area.

Furthermore, it should be noted, the Marine Parade businesses object to approvals being granted to pop-ups and other movable or semi-permanent hospitality businesses, as it would be at the expense of existing established operators.

Raised Zone A, B and C Area Comments:

We would like to see more natural shade incorportated in a way that does not diminish the ocean views from the Cottesloe Beach Hotel or its neighbours. Currently, the proposed portable trees are placed in locations which would inhibit the hotel's views (See Appendix 2, point 8). Instead, umbrellas could be placed in Zone B, which would not impact the outlook.

We believe Norfolk Island Pines should play an integral part in the greening of Zones A, B and C. Norfolk Island Pines would not inhibit the views due to their high canopy, they tie in with the existing natural look and feel of Cottesloe and in time would create a shadow line of natural shade. Currently Manly Beach, Byron Bay and other iconic locations have Norfolk Island Pines dotted along the foreshore, adding shade and grandeur to the surrounds. This would only further enhance Cottesloe's iconic image.

By introducing a series of permanent umbrellas in Zone B and Norfolk Island Pines surrounding the outer Western rim, we would be creating a naturally beautiful and flexible lounging and relaxing zone, that could also be utilised for events, yoga, fitness classes and picnicing.

Alfresco Dining:

The Cottesloe Beach Hotel will propose and submit a concept for alfresco dining, which would run from the Beach Club's entry on Warnham Street, along Marine Parade and around the corner to John Street. The alfresco offering would be similar to those of Il Lido, Vans and Canteen Pizza.

We wish to better utilise the car bays directly out the front of the Cottesloe Beach Hotel's Marine Parade entrance to create attractive alfresco dining, much the same as Van's very successful 'parklet' in Napoleon Street. The concept of pop-up seating in the car bays would not work and it needs to be a more permanent space. The road may have to be curved to naturally slow traffic.

Marine Parade:

We would strongly recommend the roadside mural outside the Cottesloe Beach Hotel be reconsidered, as we do not believe it is appropriate for Cottesloe Beach.

It is also our belief, Marine Parade should close to traffic, from Napier Street to John or Forrest Street, during major events in the new area. By diverting traffic to one of the main arterial roads in Cottesloe, Broome Street, it will allow events to be properly fenced and secured. This will allow business operators, like Canteen Pizza, Indiana and the Cottesloe Beach Hotel to better interact and service event goers with ease and safety.

Parking:

We believe Zone A and B (See Appendix 1) should be recapturered as public areas and the Napier Street Carpark 2 should be expanded. It's our belief, Carpark 2 is currently not well utilised, particularly in the evenings. We believe people forget it is there and have security concerns at night. If it was to have adequeate floodlights during peak hours, visual CCTV cameras and signage, it would be used more often. It is also of the Cottesloe Beach Hotel's opinion, Carpark 2 should be developed into a two or three storey parking area, of which part is sunken to meet height limits. The carpark is closer to the beach than in most other capital cities, including Bondi Beach in Sydney and St Kilda Beach in Melbourne.

We also strongly believe Zone D and E (See Appendix 1) should remain as carparking with the ability to activate it during event dates.

Other:

It is of our opinon, public toilets, rubbish disposal bins and waste management will need to be thouroughly considered by the Town of Cottesloe. Allowances will need to be made to meet increased patronage which will be expected as a result of the renewal strategy.

Summary:

Prior to activating this renewal strategy, there must be a vision and masterplan articulating the long term plans for the Cottesloe Beach foreshore, for the beneift of local residents, businesses and visitors. The current renewal strategy is a stepping stone that must be alligned with the greater plans for the area.

We would like to recommend a comprehensive consultation process with businesses and residents be undertaken to ensure the right outcomes are achieved for all stakeholders.

We are confident we will collectively create a new offering that enhances people's ability to enjoy, use and connect with our iconic beach, its amenties and views.



- 1 = Cottesloe Beach Hotel believes the tunnel slides are not appropirate for this location and renewal strategy.
- 2 = Agree the balustrade needs upgrading.
- 3 = More permanent lounging elements, that could be removed, are recommended.
- 4 = The Cottesloe Beach Hotel requests the petition screening be removed from the concept for fear of it blocking part of the views west from the hotel's ground floor area.
- 5 = We agree to the concept, but believe instead of vibrant colours, that neutral tones be used, fo example; light blue, light grey or navy, in keeping with the natural environment.
- 6 = The Cottesloe Beach Hotel strongly objects to any form of pop-up spaces as per the resoning in our submission above.
- 7 = Shade is needed and recommended. The shade structure itself does not relate or fit with the surrounds. The shade structure on the sand at the southern end of the beach should marry in and match with the umbrellas introduced.
- 8 = Permanent trees in other locations (perimiter beach side area of zone F, E, D and A (Indidana's side of A) makes sense but not diectly in front of Canteen Pizza and the Cottesloe Beach Hotel and the middle of what will become the future event area.
- 9 = Agree with this element, but request it be in a larger capacity and sqm allocation. Also request it be flexible in layout to allow for different size events, concerts and festivals. The event space should be level with its surrounds and sunken, and be able to link with the Zone D and E carparks (See Appendix 1: Zone D and E carparking space).
- 10 = Agree the road street scaping will need to change to reduce speeds of vehicles driving by, and allow better flow of pedestrians between the public spaces and amenities.
- 11 = Agree this is a great idea in principal, but believe it needs more size and substance to meet the reasons outlined in our submission above. It should be permanent in design and not a pop up.

Submission for consideration in response to proposed Opportunities Plan for the Cottesloe Foreshore Renewal Project.

The aforementioned proposal to alter Carpark No. 1 located on Marine Parade does not address the needs or requirements of the population using this area of Cottesloe foreshore. Cottesloe beach and surrounding area is touted as the best tourist beach in Perth metropolitan area, yet the facilities are poor or non-existent. The impractical suggestions made in the Opportunities Plan to not account for the basic needs of the locals or the out of area visitors to the beach. Needs should always be addressed and implemented before supercilious suggestions of facilities that serve no purpose or benefit.

My family and I have recently moved from Sydney to Perth, after having the pleasure of visiting and living in the city over the last 20 years. The place that we chose to base our young family was Cottesloe for the beach lifestyle, cafes and restaurants and well-maintained parks for children in the area. As the end of our first year as local residents draws closer, we have come to see the reality of the suburb and apparent oversight of the basic needs of the community. I would implore the council to address these issues prior to undergoing any unnecessary spending and development of new zones that will make it even more difficult to properly enjoy the area.

As a mother of two small children I have to drive my car to the beach, despite living in the suburb. It is impossible to take a pram close to the sand as there are stairs at every access point. Cottesloe beach is the ONLY beach in the local area that is safe for babies to paddle and toddlers to splash at certain times of the day. Local parents are all drawn to the south end of main beach for this reason. Yet, there are no amenities for them to use, change, shower or toilet the children. The public toilets and showers 'maintained' by Indiana Teahouse are an embarrassment to the suburb. Families, the elderly, visiting surf club competition members, individuals, locals and visitors are forced to use the decrepit facilities. There should be a council run toilet block, change rooms, showers, family change rooms, disabled facilities all at the main part of Cottesloe beach. The new amenities at Leighton beach are outstanding and cater to both the individual swimmer and families attending the beach and would be a good example of what could be done for Cottesloe.

The introduction of more public seating and tables in the *already existing* grassed and tiered areas of the beach would be of benefit to everyone irrespective of age or demographic, time of year or time of day of use.

For those that ride their bikes to the beach there are no bike racks within eyesight of the beach. The path adjacent to the beach encourages physical activities of walking, jogging and cycling but there are insufficient places to secure a bike to go for a swim at the end of it. The number of people using the shared pathway has increased dramatically and during peak times cannot accommodate the traffic of bikes, which should be on the road, and pedestrians, with or without dogs. This is a safety hazard that should be a priority of the council to remedy.

The handrail that skirts the park is dangerous and should be replaced with something more secure than one pipe railing 1 metre off the ground.

The carpark should be resealed and remain where it is. The argument that it will cost \$300k to just do that is not good reason to spend \$900k instead on facilities that are not required when so much more is left ignored.

Peak season does not run for 1-2months of the year but in fact, 6 months and runs from Oct-Mar inclusive. During this time of year ALL car parks and street parking are full and people are currently parking in side streets all the way to Broome St and Marmion St in some areas. It would be impossible to make a statement suggesting that the removal of Carpark No. 1 will not create a further issue during this time.

The commercial properties on Marine Parade will suffer all year round with the removal of Carpark No.1. There is insufficient street parking currently and with the changes to density proposed and general predicted population increases, this will only increase in the next 5 years and planning should be taking into consideration of these facts.

To introduce more grassed areas is unnecessary and the water and irrigation requirements should prohibit such suggestions. There are numerous playgrounds in the local area and suburb as a whole so the suggestion of yet another seems preposterous, even to a parent of small children.

A skate ramp or skate bowl would not enhance the beach front area in any way and should be placed in an underutilised area away from the foreshore not on prime land. What value would this bring to the area? It would be better placed along the train line on Railway St than at the beach.

The council should be representing the needs of the local residents and visitors to the area prior to implementing unnecessary entertainment zones. In summary the following would be beneficial to the local area to ensure basic needs are addressed:

- Retain and reseal car park
- Replace hand rail for safety reasons
- Toilet, shower and changeroom facilities
- Family friendly bathroom
- Public seating and tables in pre-existing grassed areas
- Bike racks visible from beach
- Pathway access for prams, walking aids and wheelchairs
- Separate bike path or widening of existing footpath

SUBMISSION ON FORESHORE CARPARK PRECINT PLAN.

I am sorry to be late but hope my views are taken into account in your decision making.

On 23 January 2017, I submitted comments on the Cottesloe Beach Access Paths – Style Guide. Part 5 of that submission related to Car Parking as follows:

5 Car parking

Car parks are a major source of pedestrian traffic and the dual use path provides a formal link between them. Many of the beach paths are located within easy sight of and access to car parks.

I note in the overall Beach Redevelopment Plan that the Cottesloe car park is being reduced to around half its current size. This implies two things:

- that there will be a shift of pressure to alternate car parking sites. It is important therefore that upgrading of the beach paths caters for this shift
- that there will be limited opportunity for viewing the beach from a car. In the survey carried out in the late 1970s, I found a significant number of beachgoers liked to do this. For example, elderly or incapacitated people who were not interested or capable of swimming or walking. I believe it will be a shame to restrict significantly the beach-facing carparking for this reason.

Since then I have I have not had cause to change my mind. I believe the Cottesloe carpark holds around 150 cars. If it is closed then these cars will obviously seek parking along residential streets. One only has to look at Forrest or Hammersley/Hawkstone Streets to see what street parking looks like and how it affects the owners and access.

During Sculptures by the Sea and hot weekends I have seen cars parking along Broome Street. These are exceptional events but will be more likely when 150 cars are no longer able to park at the Cottesloe carpark.

I'm not sure what the Council is trying to achieve by closing the Cottesloe carpark, without providing an alternate site. Perhaps Council could consider the following as a medium term plan:

- redevelop the Carpark north of Napier Street into a 2 level carpark with a public area including cafes, toilets, lookouts etc on the western side of the upper level.
 This would cater for beachfront parking on most days while providing more public facilities and views over the ocean.
- retain 20-30 ocean facing bays at Cottesloe for short term parking only (30-60 minutes). This would cater for visitors rather than beach-goers.

I am well aware that there are pressures to make Cottesloe "more interesting" through building an ocean pool and/or providing other attractions along the beach. The redevelopment of Scarborough or the beaches in Sydney are often mentioned as examples of what could be done.

I would like to point out that the coast at Cottesloe is very different to the two mentioned above and this does limit what can be done without affecting the processes that are operating along the coast. For a start, there is a very thin strip of land fragile sand dunes between Marine Parade and the high tide mark, broken in places by outcrops of limestone.

Why, given this limitation would Council want to encourage more people to the beach by making it "more interesting" while at the same time limiting the carparking.

Managing the thin strip of dunes should be at the forefront of Council's efforts and I am encouraged that this is in progress now.

I think it must be recognised that Cottesloe is Cottesloe – if someone wants a Scarborough let them go to Scarborough.

As background I did my Honours in sedimentary geology followed by a PhD in coastal processes and development along the WA coast. I worked in the EPA in the 1970s and later as a consultant to the EPA and private clients focussing on Coastal Management. In these roles I advised many local authorities between Esperance and Broome on coastal processes and management.

I worked with Cottesloe Council carrying out a survey on what people wanted at the beach and later designing the dual use path, the beach paths and dune restoration plan. I was also a Councillor for 4 years in the early 1980s dealing with issues such as: beach access, dune restoration, storm water disposal in soak wells, dogs on beaches and elsewhere.

I have lived at since 1970 and as such believe I am qualified to present a view based on my experience and observations (mainly of the beach between Cottesloe and Grant Street) and over time.
