Rationale

- The Probity Auditor has confirmed that it is open to Council to accept any of the tenders, consistent with our statutory obligations. Proceeding with one of the tenders is an acceptable and viable option for the Town.
- Both Tenderer's have clearly demonstrated their high capabilities for undertaking the works.
- Tenderer B has provided us with a conforming response, which exceeds budget, and an alternative response in line with the RFT requirements so it is compliant, as confirmed by the Probity Auditor.
- Tenderer B's Alternative tender offer will deliver the approved scope within the Lotterywest Grant value.
- Both Tenderers provided \$20m Public Liability cover, with only Tenderer B providing costing for the higher Insurance requirement, in its compliant tender (which exceeded the Lotterywest Grant value).
- LGIS have advised that \$20m Public Liability Insurance is sufficient cover for these types of works and appears consistent with Market expectations.
- Tenderer B's Alternative offer demonstrates better value for money than their conforming offer.
- The Town's Panel evaluating the Tenders have determined Tenderer B as the preferred Contractor.
- Rejecting all Tenders and going back out to the market has clear risks that there are price increases and no Tenders will be received within the Lotterywest Grant value.
- There is also the impact to timeframes and to the perception by a significant number in the Community who have been pushing for a Skate park to be built for many years, who will be frustrated by a further and unnecessary delay.

• For these reasons the best course is to proceed with tenderer B's alternative offer.
