The Town was re-endorsed in 2021 and 2022, and has achieved this status again this year.

The Waterwise Council Program is a partnership between Water Corporation and the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation.

The annual Native Plant Subsidy Scheme is back. During the month of May Cottesloe residents can purchase up to 80 plants per household at the subsidised price of \$2.00 each from APACE Nursery (1 Johannah Street, North Fremantle). The scheme aims to encourage biodiversity and local habitats in the western suburbs. Take advantage of the cooler weather and transform your garden or verge. This is a Western Suburbs Regional Organisation of Councils (WESROC) initiative. Please take proof of residency when you visit APACE.

If you're planning to create a waterwise garden, Town of Cottesloe residents are welcome to free mulch from the West Metro Recycling Centre. There's no need to call ahead – just visit the centre in Shenton Park (bring a shovel) and help yourself!
