## HEALTHY STREETS IN COTTESLOE

The Town of Cottesloe is working with Main Roads Western Australia to investigate opportunities to create 'Healthy Streets' in Cottesloe. The Healthy Streets approach identifies how streets can be reimaged and revitalised by considering a framework of 10 indicators that describe what humans need from their streets.

At the June 2023 Council Meeting, Council resolved to support a Healthy Streets trial, focusing on Broome Street and Marmion Street between Forrest Street and Grant Street. To inform the Healthy Streets analysis, the Town of Cottesloe would like to find out how our community use Broome Street and Marmion Street, and how these streets rate against the Healthy Street Indicators.
