HEALTHY STREETS CONSULTATION

The Town of Cottesloe invites final feedback from our community on proposed concept plans to create 'Healthy Streets' on Broome Street and Marmion Street (between Forrest Street and Grant Street). Following consultation late last year and earlier this year, traffic calming and pedestrian-friendly treatments have been considered to enhance safety and create a healthier environment for all users of Broome Street and Marmion Street.

Information from this stage of community consultation will be used to finalise a design concept to submit a funding proposal to Main Roads Western Australia. DRAFT LOCAL PLANNING STRATEGY OPEN FOR COMMENT

The Town of Cottesloe has prepared a new draft Local Planning Strategy (LPS), a document that will set the vision and aspirations for planning over the next 10-15 years. The draft LPS has been prepared taking into consideration feedback gathered from the community in 2019 and mid-2023, broader Town and State strategic documents and analysis of the local community profile.

The draft LPS is now open for comment. It is available to view online at Engage Cottesloe and in-person at the Town's Administration office and the Grove Library.

WINTER PLANTING COMPLETE

Our Winter Street Tree planting program is complete! We have planted 120 new street trees over the past few months which is a record number for the Town! Please help us look after these trees and give your new street tree a water as the weather warms up.

We have also planted 4,000 tubestock (including 2,000 spinifex to create a "spinifex belt") to stabilise the dunes at Cottesloe Main Beach and in south Cottesloe near Vlamingh memorial. Another 1,500 tubestock were planted at John Black Dune Park around the new Skate Park, which completes the first stage of planting at this site. Plus, 2,000 plants were put in on verges and roundabouts to increase waterwise gardens and habitats throughout the Town.

The amazing Cottesloe Coastcare volunteers have also completed their winter season with over 5,400 native seedlings planted across several sites including 2,200 seedlings on the Grant Street dunes and at Grant Marine Park, and 2,200 seedlings planted between Sydney Street and Vlamingh in South Cottesloe. A total of 800 seedlings were planted along the railway reserve and on the foreshore opposite Pearse Street with Cottesloe Primary School, as part of the Adopt a Beach program. Native seedlings were also planted along the Principal Shared Path and other Coastcare sites. A big thank you to these dedicated volunteers for their hard work!



TIME FOR A SPRING CLEAN

Spring is a great time for a clean up! For anything that can't be donated or given away a Verge Valet service can be booked at a time that suits you. Up to two bulk waste collections and one green waste collection is available to households each year. If additional green waste collections are preferred, one or both of the bulk waste collections can be changed to green.
