A GOLD WATERWISE COUNCIL!

The Town of Cottesloe has been re-endorsed and recognised as a Gold Waterwise Council in 2025. This endorsement was achieved for the first time in 2020 and the Town has been recognised each year since for demonstrating innovation and leadership in creating waterwise communities. Projects like our native waterwise gardens and verges help us achieve this recognition, as well as our initiatives to encourage our community to become waterwise, like the Native Waterwise Verge Rebate and the Native Plant Subsidy Scheme. The Town was also commended for our proactive efforts to look after the environment through events, and in collaboration with Coastcare and Perth NRM. The Waterwise Council Program is a partnership between Water Corporation and the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation.

NATIVE WATERWISE VERGES

If you make the transition to a native, waterwise verge, you could be eligible for a rebate of \$15 per m2 of verge you convert (up to a maximum of \$500). It's the perfect time to plant a native waterwise verge – during the month of May residents can purchase natives plants for \$3.00 each from APACE Nursery as part of the Native Plant Subsidy Scheme.
