



SAFER, CALMER STREETS ON THE WAY

The Town is delivering safer, more pedestrian-friendly streets, with works set to begin later this month along Broome and Marmion Streets. A 1km stretch will see new zebra crossings and raised platforms installed to help slow traffic and improve safety. These upgrades have been co-designed with local residents, and The Town thanks everyone who contributed. The project is supported by Main Roads funding.

PARKING IMPROVEMENTS IN PROGRESS

The Town is taking steps to improve parking in high-demand areas, particularly within the Town Centre. The aim is to ensure bays remain accessible for shoppers, diners and visitors. Community feedback on our Draft Parking Strategy has played an important role, and all submissions are currently being reviewed. Further updates will be shared in the coming months.
