THE LESSER HALL - A REVITALISED **COMMUNITY FACILITY**

Renovations have commenced on the well-used community facility at Cottesloe Civic Centre. the Lesser Hall. This project will see the historic building restored and refurbished while recognising its significant historic value.

The refurbishment includes repairing and reinforcing the original building structure and a major internal upgrade which will provide a new modern kitchen, new floor coverings and new toilet facilities.

Once refurbished, the hall will be the perfect space to hold community meetings, training and small events. Subject to weather, it is anticipated that the Lesser Hall will be available in the early months of 2017.

- commencement of Cottesloe Foreshore Redevelopment Plan;
- redevelopment of Station Street;
- refurbishment of limestone walls at Cottesloe Beach foreshore;
- ongoing replacement and upgrading of footpaths and construction of new ones; and
- upgrades to beach foreshore paths.
