Please be mindful that *Sculpture by the Sea* is a very popular event and there will be extra pedestrians on the footpaths and additional cars on the roads at this busy time.

If you live in surrounding suburbs, we encourage you to catch the train and the convenient free Cott Cat shuttle bus, which will run every 15 minutes from 10.30am until 6pm in a loop between Cottesloe Train Station (west of the train tracks) and the beach (opposite Indiana) every day during the exhibition.

We also encourage you to walk or ride! Sculpture by the Sea is even more accessible this year thanks to the new Principal Shared Path (PSP) extension in Cottesloe. Visitors north and south of Cottesloe can safely walk or ride along the path and travel down to the foreshore. Additional bike parking is available in Car Park One. Thank you to the Department of Transport for their ongoing support and encouraging active and sustainable transport in Cottesloe!

There is also the option of leaving your bike securely in the bike locker located by the PSP at Forrest Street and catching the Cott Cat shuttle bus from the designated bus stop there.

NATIVE WATERWISE VERGE REBATE

The Town's Native Waterwise Verge Rebate program is being offered again this year. Native waterwise verges help save water and increase plant biodiversity. By making the change to a native waterwise verge, residents may be eligible for a rebate of \$15 per m2 of converted verge, with a maximum claim value of \$500.
