LONG TERM CYCLE NETWORK

The Town has been working with the Department of Transport (DoT) since 2018 on a draft Long Term Cycle Network (LTCN) that the DoT is preparing for the Perth to Peel region. That year, the Town prepared an online survey and invited residents to participate. Responses received were used to develop various routes for the LTCN, which were supported by Council in 2019 before being submitted to the State Government for consideration. The DoT then presented a draft LTCN for Cottesloe which was recently put out to the community for further consultation and brought back to Council for endorsement at the April 2020 Council Meeting.

The draft LTCN is a concept plan which designates a hierarchy of cycle routes as Primary, Secondary or Local. The main purpose of the document is for allocating future funding by the State Government. Once that has been established, the Town will consult with our community and work collaboratively with residents on designs developed for Council approval. NATURE DISCOVERY SPACE

Construction of the Cottesloe Nature Discovery Space near Vlamingh Memorial is complete.

Built by Nature Based Play in a dune restoration site above South Cottesloe beach, this amazing new space features water play, logs and rocks to climb and balance on, cubby frames and building sticks, rock and log carvings, ropes, winding paths, a fairy bridge and new plantings.

Cottesloe Nature Discovery Space has been a joint project with Cottesloe Coastcare (including Community Environment Funding raised via the office of Celia Hammond MP) and the Town of Cottesloe. We are excited that the space is complete and we look forward to announcing an opening event as soon as we can!



IT'S BULK WASTE COLLECTION TIME

Bulk waste collections commence this weekend. Items that can be placed out include; furniture, plastics, appliances, electronic waste, timber products, mattresses, cardboard and white goods (doors must be removed from fridges and freezers). Items that will not be collected are building materials, tyres, hazardous chemicals and poisons, flammable liquids, gas cylinders. Green waste will also not be collected. Please do not place your items out until the weekend prior to your collection date. Place items neatly on your verge no later than 7am on the Monday of your collection week. Collection will occur during the next five days.

Area 1

Place out on the weekend of 9/10 May. Items will be collected from Monday, 11 May

Area 2

Place out on the weekend of 16/17 May. Items will be collected from Monday, 18 May

Area 3

Place out on the weekend of 23/24 May. Items will be collected from Monday, 25 May.
