



PLANTING ALONG THE PSP

As part of our commitment to increasing the tree canopy along the Principal Shared Path in Cottesloe, we have planting 60 mature native trees from Grant Street to Victoria Street.

We would like to thank our community for providing their feedback on the PSP Greening Masterplan in December last year, and thank Main Roads WA and the Department of Transport for their financial contribution for these trees.

We are also planting 4,000 tubestock (native tree and shrub species) with more next winter to create a continuous shade canopy along the PSP for the future.

NEW ACROD BAY AT ERIC STREET



In response to feedback from community representatives on the Town's Universal Access and Inclusion Community Reference Group, a new ACROD bay has recently been installed at Eric Street Shopping Centre. It was highlighted to the Town that the existing ACROD Bay at the Centre, located in the undercover carpark, was unable to be utilised by wheelchair accessible vans due to insufficient height clearance.

Eric Street Shopping Centre provides essential services to local residents including a supermarket, pharmacy and medical centre. The new ACROD Bay provides improved access to these services to those with wheelchair vans such as Ms Ellen Robinson and her son Ewen (Ewen and his twin brother Declan are pictured here with Mayor Phil Angers and Councillor Helen Sadler, Chair of the Universal Access and Inclusion Community Reference Group).

SOLAR AT THE GROVE

The Town's of Cottesloe and Mosman Park, and the Shire of Peppermint Grove have joined together to fund the installation of solar panels at the Grove Library to reduce energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions.

The Grove Library was identified as an ideal facility for a large solar PV installation as the majority of energy used is during daylight hours when the solar PV is most efficient.

An 80kw solar system was installed on the Grove Library's roof. The anticipated reduction in CO2 is 121 tonnes per year, which equates to planting 847 trees!

DOG EXERCISE AREAS

There are many off-lead dog exercise areas in the Town of Cottesloe. Dogs can be off-lead at two locations along Cottesloe Beach; the southern dog beach (south of Dutch Inn Groyne to Cottesloe LGA southern boundary) and the northern dog beach (from Lot 67 Marine Parade to Cottesloe LGA northern boundary).

Dogs can also be off-lead at Cottesloe Oval and Harvey Field, John Black Dune Reserve, Grant Marine Park, Andrews Place and Jasper Green Reserve. Dogs can also now be off-lead at Sea View golf course between the hours of 6pm and 6am only.

Locations near the train line include open space along Curtin Avenue and Railway Street to the Public Transport Authority boundary fence. As per the *Dog Act 1976* dogs must be on their lead at all other times in public open spaces and under effective control.

The Town's Rangers are responsible for enforcing the *Dog Act 1976* and failure to comply may incur a fine. To find out more and view a designated off-lead dog area map visit www.cottesloe.wa.gov.au/services/ranger-services-and-community-safety/animal-control.aspx.
