RESTORING COASTAL DUNES

We have had another successful year restoring coastal dunes. Over 10,000 seedlings were planted during winter in degraded areas to increase biodiversity, restore habitats and provide dune stability. Spring is a time for weed control works with contractors and Cottesloe Coastcare volunteers working hard to remove weeds before seeds set. In summer we will water and mulch new seedlings to help them survive the drier months. We ask that you please stay off the dunes and help our dune restoration projects thrive!

The event would have required limited numbers in attendance and rather than having to exclude members of our community, a decision was made to cancel the event this year.
