FORESHORE UPGRADE - ROTUNDA

The Town of Cottesloe is working on the refurbishment of the foreshore at the rotunda, located near the children's playground on Marine Parade. The refurbishment includes repairing and levelling the dual use path, as well as dune and drainage outfall stabilisation, followed by revegetation works. A preliminary design has been developed and it is expected that construction will occur in winter 2021.
