#### THE COVE ACCESS PATH COMPLETE

Upgrades at beach access path S15 (known as The Cove) are complete. The path opened recently and has been a welcome addition to the foreshore.

The path features new access stairs - Fibre Reinforced Plastic treads for the upper section and micro-mesh grating for the lower section with an anti-slip treatment for safety, and an upgraded access node with informal seating, shower and signage.

The Town's CEO Matthew Scott and Councillor Melissa Harkins checked out the new path earlier this week and were pleased to see it being very well used!
