GOOD TO FOGO

Good news from the Town – most of our community will soon be Good to FOGO. FOGO (which stands for Food Organics Garden Organics) is coming to Cottesloe in June. This means that green lidded Garden Organics bins will become Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) bins. Kitchen scraps can be put into your green lidded bin when we change to the new system.

More information and a small kitchen caddy (to help you collect kitchen scraps) will be delivered to households just before the changeover – and then you'll be Good to FOGO! 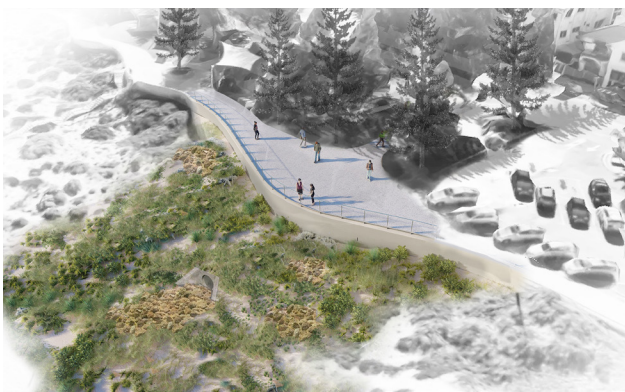

FORESHORE REPAIR WORKS

Repair works on the foreshore have begun in an area that was badly damaged during a heavy storm (near the children's playground on Marine Parade, opposite Napier Street). The work involves construction of a drainage system designed for large storm events. In times of very heavy rainfall, overflow from Marine Parade will be directed across the footpath on to a vegetated area at the bottom of the dunes. Pollutants from the water are filtered before the water reaches the ocean and filtered litter will be picked up and disposed of as part of the Town's regular beach clean-up program.
