EXPERIENCE THE HISTORIC COTTESLOE JETTY

A GOLD WATERWISE COUNCIL!

The Town of Cottesloe has been re-endorsed and recognised as a Gold Waterwise Council. In 2020 the Town achieved Gold recognition as a Waterwise Council for demonstrating innovation and leadership in creating waterwise communities. The Town was re-endorsed in 2021 and has achieved this status again this year.

Projects like the two large native waterwise gardens planted in Andrew's Place park last year are just one example of the initiatives that help us achieve this recognition. The gardens, which were planted with tube stock around 12 months ago by Town of Cottesloe staff (including Troy and Matt, who recently went to check on their progress with Mayor Lorraine Young), are looking great!

The Waterwise Council Program is a partnership between Water Corporation and the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation.
