We are calling for our community to get involved and help us prepare some guiding plans for Cottesloe.

The Town is preparing a Coastal Hazard Risk Management and Adaptation Plan (CHRMAP) to identify key assets along the coast and determine measures we can take to preserve them against the impact of coastal hazards. We invite our community to find out more by attending an information session on Saturday, 17 September (9am to 12pm on the Cottesloe foreshore) or Wednesday, 21 September (4 to 5pm at the Lesser Hall). You can also register your interest to stay informed about the process and the engagement activities along the way, and complete a Coastal Values Survey.

The Town is also working on a strategy for managing our local history and heritage. The preparation of a Heritage Strategy for Cottesloe will allow us to protect and preserve the stories, objects and places that are important for our local history and identity. We invite you to register your interest to be involved in the preparation of the Town's Heritage Strategy.

Verge Valet has been a great success with many local Councils now offering it to their community. Up to two bulk waste collections and one green waste collection is available to households each year. If additional green waste collections are preferred, one or both of the bulk waste collections can be changed to green.

Although items are sorted after collection to recover whatever is possible, Verge Valet is for rubbish. Before you book we encourage you to look at options available to gift, sell, donate, fix or swap items in the first instance.
