Indiana toilets – Council action

DIRECT action by the Town will make sure that public toilets below the Indiana Tea House are clean this summer.

From December 1 until April 1, 2016 – the peak period for Cottesloe Beach use – cleaning services will be provided by Cottesloe. This service will be provided from

7am to 7pm, seven days a week.

If the Indiana restaurant lessee requires use of the toilets outside these hours, they will be responsible for cleaning. Previously, the lessee has been responsible for maintaining cleanliness of the facilities at all times.

Total cost of the summer cleaning will be \$40,000, with the Indiana contributing \$16,000.

The new cleaning agreement does not include any other maintenance cost of the facility, which remains exclusively with the Indiana lessee.

IN line with Council aim to achieve best practice in managing all risks that may affect the Town, Cottesloe has adopted a Risk Management Policy (based on Australia/New Zealand ISO 31000:2009 standard). Such a policy is a legal requirement. Among its aims is compliance with relevant legislation and regulations, as well as internal Council policies.

Every employee, Councillor, volunteer and contractor within the Town has a role to play in risk management – ranging from the identification of risks, to implementing risk treatments.

will also run until 1am to make sure you get to the train safely.

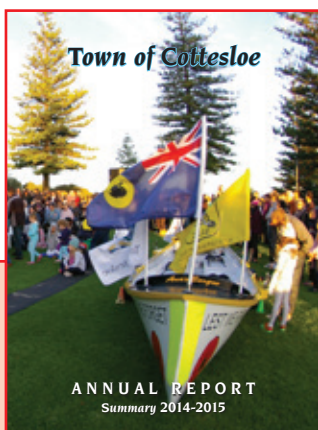
Heading to Sculpture by the Sea?
