Midnight Hotel Hours? No

COTTESLOE BEACH Hotel proprietors want to trade until midnight instead of the present 10pm closing time, but the Council opposes the move.

The Town has informed the Director of Liquor Licensing that no change in hours is warranted at this time. Since acquiring the hotel the owners have made improvements, completed only in November, to the building and beer garden. The Council believes the trading hours status quo should be maintained so the effect of the changes can be assessed.

Residents near the CBH have been notified of the request for extended hours; and the Town will monitor any complaints emanating from the re-opened hotel.

Council calling!

SOME residents have called the Council to check if recent phone calls, consulting them about the future of Cottesloe, are legitimate.

They have been assured that the callers are consultants working for the Council.

The calls, to randomlyselected households, are a prelude to a local strategic plan. All local governments in the State are required to comply. Details are likely to be released in February or March after a councillors' briefing and workshop.

... of the times – that the Council is reviewing its Local Law covering Signs, Hoardings and Bill Postings.

Since the law's inception new technology has advanced the industry and the Town will now consult businesses and the general community on the topic. Details are available at the Town offices and online. Submissions are requested by Friday February 22, 2013.

PARENTS using prams, older people, and those with disabilities will all soon enjoy easier access to the main Cottesloe beach. Construction on the \$300,000 footpath (made possible by a \$200,000 Lottery West grant) will start in April, after the summer rush abates.

The path leads from the Cott SLSC down the slope to the roadway south of the Indiana. It's a component of the Town's Foreshore Redevelopment Plan and one requested by the community for many years.

Original design has been modified in consultation with the Council's Disability Services Advisory Committee and Dr Linley Lutton (Director of Urban Design at UWA) to meet all disability access standards.

Plans have now been sent to WAPC and the State Heritage Office for approval – and are available for inspection on the Council website.

Blackspot project for Curtin Avenue

TWO pedestrian crossing islands opposite Mosman Park station, and a connecting footpath on the west side of Curtin Avenue, have been designed to cope with a Blackspot recognised in a 2011 safety audit. The site was one of several mentioned in a petition to Council at that time.

Local community must keep their Civic Centre

IN February Town staff will report to the Council on ways to lock into place the entitlement of the local community to retain the Civic Centre for access and public use.

The matter was raised once more and highlighted when the Council discussed an invitation, from the Town of Claremont, that all councillors from their proposed 'G4 merger' councils (Claremont, Cottesloe, Mosman Park and Peppermint Grove) meet to discuss amalgamations.

Cottesloe has confirmed that all its individual councillors may attend the meeting, and that Cottesloe has previously resolved to support such a merger. But it stressed that Cottesloe voters must

have the right to veto any

decisions.

TO make parking restrictions more consistent in Napoleon Street, four of the 15-minute bays have been changed to one-hour bays.

This means that all the standard bays west of 31 Napoleon St are now 1-hour, Mon-Fri 8am/6pm; and 8am/1pm. All standard bays east of no 31 (post office end of the street) are now 15 minute bays.
