After all comments are considered the Town will work to finalise designs during 2014 and continue with approvals, funding and a construction time-



IT'S a fair swap – a brand-new red bin-lid for that dull old one! Between 18 and 29 November 2013, please leave your SMALLER, 120L general rubbish bin out right through the entire collection day - or all the next collection day - until the lid has been replaced with a RED one.

Example

If your collection day is Monday, please leave your bin out until 5pm on 18 November. If the contractors have not been able to change the lids on your street, please leave the bin out again right through the following Monday, 25 November.

The same approach ap-

plies to residents with different collection days.

The 120L general rubbish bins will continue to be collected weekly.

Greens Bin

During this same period residents of singleresidential properties will also have delivered 240L Greens Bin as part of the new Three Bin System.

This bin is being provided at no charge, so you can separate your garden waste and green organics. To assist, please avoid contaminating the Greens Bin with things like plastic and green waste bags, and beverage containers.

Sea View repairs needed



COST of essential repairs to the Sea View Golf Club buildings will be shared between the Club and the Council. Sea View's contribution will be made with an extension of the Club's current loan from the Town, which was raised to improve reticulation of the course.

The club is on Crown reserve land vested in the Town, and the course is State heritage listed. The premises form part of the Town's social heritage value and both the course and building form a key community recreational asset for Cottesloe.

The clubhouse building has suffered from exposure to the coastal ele-Concrete re are needed, as are replacements of a timber sleeper retaining wall, and a steel patio and verandah.

The repairs will extend the life of the club premises and enable future additions/renovations to improve the amenities for members and visitors.

CTC wants to grow

THE Council has given in-principle support to the Cottesloe Tennis Club (CTC) proposal to expand into a portion of John Black Dune Park adjacent to the current courts.

However, Council support is subject to community consultation – and Town staff have been instructed to begin the process with suitable advertising as soon as the concept is firmed-up.

The Council has also confirmed the commitment, expressed in the Natural Areas Management Plan, to maintain as much as possible of the Dune Park for community use.

CTC is now six years into a 21-year lease from the Town, on Crown land



which is vested in the Town and reserved for recreation. John Black Dune Park and Car Park No. 2 are part of the same regional reserve.

Although recognised as a green space the Park is not formally landscaped or greatly used.

The club began in the 1930s and is a key community recreational resource, with a 500-strong membership ranging from children to seniors. Tennis continues to be a popular and growing sport, with increasing demand for access to courts. There is a trend towards night tennis and hard courts for reduced maintenance and water consumption.

EVERYONE will be welcomed to Carols by Candlelight on the Main Lawn, Civic Centre, from 6pm on December 22. The programme begins at 7pm.

Bring friends and family for a relaxed picnic, followed by carol singing to make a joyous start to the true Christmas season.

Electric candles and treats will be given to the children. BYO picnic and rug, or low chairs. Parking is available on the Western Lawn; enter from Broome Street near the roundabout.

In support of improving the Town's waste services with a three-bin system, Cottesloe has appointed contractor Perthwaste, which, following a tender process, is considered to be the most competitive and beneficial to Town.

As well as providing current waste and recycling services, Perthwaste will also collect Cottesloe's fortnightly waste and process it in-house to ensure maximum possible waste diversion from landfill.

Perthwaste is also currently contract-ed by several other Western Suburbs
