Expect 'offer we can't refuse';

ANTICIPATING harsh recommendations from the Robson report (now online for public comment) Mayor Kevin Morgan predicted it would be followed-up with 'an offer we can't refuse'.

"For the next few months the Council will be asked consider voluntary amalgamation. Otherwise it could end up in a worse position," he told the October Council meeting.

"My primary concern is ensuring the community is consulted."

Candidature

Referring to his decision to stand for parliament in the seat of Cottesloe, Mr Morgan said he will endeavour to remain on Council business while acting as Mayor. At times issues may cross over, but he will continue acting in the Council's best interest as he observes it.

All plastic and aluminium containers (with the 10c refund in SA/NT label) will be accepted. Fetch your collection to the beach, near Indiana, between 11am and 3pm, and go away with money in your pocket!

The refunds are capped at \$10 per person – that means 100 containers – or \$100 for school or community groups – 1,000 containers!

Hullabaloo's collection and the beach clean-up are part of Cottesloe's support for the introduction of a permanent scheme for WA.

WALGA - WA's Local Government Association is campaigning for it and Cottesloe backs the idea.

WA's overall recycling rate is one of Australia's lowest, at just 32 per cent. By comparison, national leader South Australia recycles more than 70 per

WE'RE not sure if this UFO will change orbit to visit Cottesloe - but elite and exotic cars of all kinds will be exhibited on the Civic Centre lawns when the Celebration of the Motor Car returns on Sunday December 16, from 10.30am-3.30pm.

Charity will benefit, with 100 per cent of entry fees (\$20 adults, \$10 children) going to Kalparrin - which aids families and carers of children with disability and/or special needs.

This motor show was inaugurated at the Civic Centre in 1993 and awarded the year's WA Motoring Event of the Year. It was so popular that after five years it moved to a bigger location, at Claremont Teachers College, continuing there until 2003.

Organisers want to revive the Celebration of the Motor Car and won approval from Cottesloe Council, which



has classed it as a charity event and will charge no exhibition fees.

Restrictions on vehicle access should ensure minimal local noise disturbance, and measures have been taken to protect the lawns and reticulation systems of the Civic Centre.
