

## Fremantle Port dredging

AT its December meeting, Cottesloe Council resolved to lodge a submission to the Federal Minister for the Environment in relation to the dredging of the Fremantle Port. Copies were also sent to the Fremantle Port Authority and Environmental Protection Authority.

That submission is based on a Cottesloe-commissioned consultants' report (now available on the Town website).

It includes a request that measures be taken to ensure there are no adverse effects on the visual, aesthetic and recreational amenity of Cottesloe beaches, including major events such as the Rottnest Channel Swim.

The Council has asked for full environmental assessment, and public consultation, on the dumping of dredged material at Rous Head and in Gage Roads.

Sculpture by Sea gets extra help

COTTESLOE'S popular annual art show, Sculpture by the Sea, is to be given extra Council support this year after posting a \$25,000 loss in 2009.

Although well-attended the last-minute loss of a major sponsor is believed to have caused the shortfall.

For this years' exhibition on the beach and foreshore (March 4 - 23) Cottesloe will provide extra 'in-kind' support valued at \$10,000. This is likely to include provision

of extra toilet facilities, etc. To cover this un-budgeted increase the Council's art acquisition budget has been reduced, to \$30,000.

In the coming budget for 2010-2011, Cottesloe will consider increasing its Sculpture by the Sea contribution.

# CUSHIONS WILL CURB JOHN ST SPEEDERS

TO make a safer intersection at the John Street/Broome Street Blackspot Cottesloe is asking Main Roads to approve rubber speed cushions at the site.

Good lighting is necessary at each of the cushions so the proposal includes upgraded street lighting. The estimated total cost to the annual budget would be \$23,000, which will be considered by the Council for approval in the new financial year.

Main Roads sets all speed zone levels in the State and

must view and approve all installations.

#### Speeding

Speeding on Broome Street is a well-established problem, with the crest outside the Civic Centre and the dip at John St compounding the situation.

The most recent crash at the junction occurred at the end of November 2009.


## The Cat came back!
