LOCAL MERGERS

RTG won't work for Cottesloe

IN APRIL Cottesloe asked residents if we should join other local councils in a process that could lead into a Regional Transition Group (RTG).

Now the Council has told State government that 'in light of the positions adopted by the Town of Mosman Park and the Shire of Peppermint Grove' Cottesloe is unable to participate in an RTG with suitable partners.

COTTESLOE Council will consult over an accurate design concept for a second stage of renovation work on the Beach Pylon. An accurate estimate of the possible cost will also be obtained from a quantity surveyor and the Council will give support to a fundraising campaign.

Councillor Rob Rowell will be the Council representative on any Appeal Advisory Committee that is appointed.

According to staff, previous work dealt with the most fragile part of the pylon. However, ongoing flaking of the concrete base and subsequent exposure of reinforcing steel may eventually endanger the struc-

Council defers action on drinkers

COTTESLOE Council will give new owners of the Cottesloe Beach Hotel time to demonstrate their management approach before taking action on permitted patron numbers.

Over the past two summers, the Council has collected evidence of unacceptable behaviour in the streets of the Town by customers of the two beachfront hotels.

Armed with this information Council officers were ready to make a section 64

application under the Liquor License Control Act to reduce the number of drinkers permitted in the hotels.

However, because of the recently announced sale of the CBH, the Council voted to wait and allow the new owners time to show how they plan to change the ethos of the hotel.

Speaking at last month's Council meeting, Mayor Kevin Morgan highlighted the issues of concern and the changes that have been noticed in recent times and suggested that deferring the licensing application for three months would allow the new owners time to present their plans and make changes.

COMMUNITY safety and crime prevention are important factors in Cottesloe's strategic planning. An updated Safer Sustainable Cottesloe Plan 2010-2014 now augments the overall strategy.

and monitor anti-social behaviour on the beachfront area by improving the Town's security systems and CCTV networks.

REDUCE

crime, including graffiti, in the central business district of the Town by extending the CCTV network to the area.

awareness of safety on the roads, including safe roads, roadsides, vehicles, speeds and road (as outlined in the Road Safety Council's Strategic Action Plan.)

INCREASE

the safety of, and access to, Council owned buildings.

EDUCATE

residents on the importance of home, business and vehicle security to prevent theft and damage to property.

PROMOTE

safe consumption of alcohol and raise awareness the outcomes of abuse of alcohol and other drugs.
