DAPs = State control

THE State government proposal to set up DAPs (Development Assessment Panels) and remove planning control over large projects from local councils has been comprehensively rejected by Cottesloe Council.

Cottesloe has demanded that the State abandon the idea.

The Council has also called for WALGA (WA Local Government Association) to arrange a suitable protest including the mass resignation of all metropolitan councils - if the State proceeds with DAPs.

Are you in the Swim?



LAST year's outstanding West Coast 1000 swim drew more than 1500 swimmers to Cottesloe beach in a record-breaking attempt that set a WA crowd record. This time (Saturday November 28, between 9.30am and 1pm) there will be a 1000m swim for beginners, a 1600m event for the more advanced and a 500m invitation race. World record mark for swim crowd numbers is 3000.

Keeping beach front clean

WARM weather draws so many people to Cottesloe's beaches that a summer litter collection system is implemented each year. To avoid overflowing rubbish bins, the Council has decided that in future the summer service should begin earlier – during September - if fine weather with temperatures above 20°C are predicted.

Caring for street trees

ALL large street trees in Cottesloe will be inspected every year under a 'best practice' manual adopted by the Council.

The manual is a guide for Town staff involved in tree management. Also, in the next budget, Council will consider allocating \$10,000 for an annual consultant inspection of the large trees.

John Street

After laboratory and consultant reports on a Norfolk Island pine removed from John Street the Council has decided to budget for a long-term annual programme to remove and replace the four trees (of any species) considered to be most unstable and potentially damaging if they


should collapse. Removal will be based on expert opinion and discussion with nearby residents and landowners. The trees could be of any species - but if any Norfolk Island pine is removed it will generally be replaced with another. Details of the plan will be advertised for public comment in the near future and prior to budget discussions.
